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



Sue has dedicated many hours to establishing a relationship with local churches in the Temecula area. *Bread from Heaven* is now participating with these other churches and receiving extra food, cleaning supplies, and personal hygiene items for the people we serve.

Every Monday TUMC opens its doors and provides food to many families. Our food pantry is run by volunteers and one exceptional volunteer is Joan Jessup. Joan not only volunteers the second Monday of each month, she also spends countless hours cutting coupons, shopping, organizing and putting food away and writing thank you notes to our donors. We offer a heartfelt thank you to Joan!

#### **YOUTH NEWS**

Well – It's summer time again and that means it's time for "Summer Sunday Nights". This is where we change our usual format for Sunday evenings. We will be doing different events all summer to help our incoming 6<sup>th</sup> graders get to know other youth group members. The first leg of our trip is to Davis, CA, where we will spend the night at a local Methodist Church and meet up with Stephanie Wilson who is returning from a family vacation. We will then go on to Bend, Oregon where we will be met by three other youth groups and we will share worship time and a meal together. Our third travel day will bring us to Pendleton, Oregon where we will spend the week living in teepees and working on the local Indian Reservation on the residents' homes.

After a week of work, play and meeting and growing new friendships, we will start our trek home. We will leave Pendleton, Oregon at 9:00 am Saturday July 15<sup>th</sup> for our 1200 mile traveling through 5-states in a two-day trip home. We will be staying the night in Sandy, Utah on the way home with our arrival back at TUMC late Sunday night, July 16<sup>th</sup>.

We are doing our final fundraising asking members to sponsor sections of the trip. We figure it will cost around \$40.00 for every 100 miles so you can see any donation would be appreciated.

Look for the end of summer ice cream social to celebrate this trip. We will be offering ice cream and an audio visual extravaganza to show you how our trip went.
