A Fantastic Place to Worship!

During the month of January 2006, TUMC held a wonderful, spiritually based experience culminating on Consecration Sunday held January 29th. The focus of our experience has been to use our financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in our relationship with God by supporting our church's mission and ministry with a percentage of our income. I am very happy to report the results of our campaign and the outstanding response of our Congregation members and friends. The following results are as of February 19, 2006.

A total of 117 families (husbands and wives, single parent families and singles) worshiping at TUMC completed *Estimate of Giving Cards* for the calendar year 2006. As of February 19, these **117** families have committed a total of **\$216,620.00.** Of these estimators, 99 have increased their financial commitment above their 2005 giving. In 2005 they contributed \$163,573.00. These same families have increased their estimates to the Church for 2006 by **\$53,047.00** which represents a wonderful increase of **32.4** percent.

Based on last year's (2005) giving records, TUMC can expect to receive an additional **\$54,564.00** during the coming year from 69 families who have consistent giving patterns during the past twelve months, but have not made estimates as of February 19, 2006.

Based on the average total of loose plate offering during the past three years, TUMC can expect to receive an additional **\$8,900.00** in 2006. TUMC also receives income from several other sources such as interest, facilities rentals, holiday offerings and the sale of SCRIP for a total of approximately **\$50,000.00**. Adding all of these estimates together gives TUMC a grand total of **\$330,084.00** as anticipated income for the next twelve months (2006). The total amount (**\$330,084.00**) will now be used by the Finance Committee to pull together a 2006 budget for the Church.

The Consecration Sunday Committee knows of no other way to express our gratitude to all who support this Church except to say **Thank You and God Bless**



STEPHEN MINISTRY CALLING ALL CAREGIVERS: WE NEED YOU

Our congregation's Stephen Ministry is currently recruiting for a class to be held over the late spring and summer months. Stephen Ministry is a highly acclaimed lay caregiver ministry. Stephen Ministry is unique. Unlike other lay ministries, each minister goes through 50 hours of specialized training. In that training, ministers learn the underlying principles of Christian caregiving, and specific techniques and strategies which are appropriate and helpful to lay ministers. Our Stephen Ministry is especially important as it gives our pastor a reliable well-trained lay support system. We are a caring congregation, and all of us have a role to play in the care of our congregation members whether we are Stephen ministers or not. However, Stephen Ministers are uniquely qualified to give quality care under appropriate supervision and support by the Stephen Leader and the pastor. Unlike other caregivers, the Stephen Minister is bound by the principle of strict confidentiality. Not even other Stephen ministers know who each other's care receivers are, or what is said in the privacy of the caregiver—care receiver relationship. It is the most rewarding ministry I have ever been involved in.

Basic Qualifications for Stephen Ministry training:

- 1. Believer in the teachings of Jesus Christ
- 2. Member of this congregation
- 3. Able to devote at least 2 1/2 hours / week class time during training
- 4. Able to make a two year commitment
- 5. Able to see care receiver(s) once a week
- 6. Able to attend monthly supervisory meetings
- 7. Good listener who enjoys caring for others.


Second Semi-Annual Temecula UMC Family Camp
