Rick's Ramblings

Resurrection

Resurrection is one of the main tenets of our faith. The oldest Christian creed or set of beliefs is the Apostles Creed. It states in the second to the last line, "I believe in the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting." There have been many thoughts and understandings of resurrection since the time of the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament). In the time leading up to the birth of Jesus there were Jewish movements that furthered that understanding and belief. But it was Jesus who brought it square into the forefront as God's promise that will be realized by all people. This promise was acted out by Jesus' own resurrection to demonstrate the defeat of death. Death is not an end to life but a continuation of life in spirit.

Paul's writes in I Corinthians 15: 51-55, "Listen, I tell you a mystery: We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed - in a flash, in a twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed. For the perishable must clothe itself with the imperishable, the mortal with immortality. When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true: 'Death has been swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" I believe it is through realizing this promise that our faith is emboldened in hope. Even during our times of grief and mourning, in our times of deepest despair, in our times of daily struggles darkness does not overtake us because of the new life we have in our belief in Christ. We are strengthen by this hope in the promise realized, we are encouraged in our faith, we are able to express this hope in how we live our lives through our actions to serve, to offer compassion, to forgive, and to love as God has loved us through Jesus the Christ.

John wrote in *Revelation* 21: 1-5: "Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and there was no longer any sea. I saw the Holy City, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from *Continued on page 3*

God, prepared as a bride beautifully dressed for her husband. And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying 'Look! God's dwelling place is now among the people, and he will dwell with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God." He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away. He who was seated on the throne said, 'I am making everything new!'" Through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, God made all things new, renewed life, renewed hope.



In the Merriam-Webster's online Dictionary one of the definitions for resurrection is resurgence, revival. As we celebrate Easter, I want to invite you to look forward to the weeks and months following that we pray on how we as a church family and as individuals can be resurrected, to have a resurgence and revival in faith.
