### **Rick's Ramblings** CAL-PAC CONFERENCE Submitted by Rev. Marlene Oaks

It was my joy and honor to be the Lay Representative from our church to our annual conference. The theme was "From Here to There," (based on *Matthew* 10:5-11) and it included—Transforming Christian Leaders, Transforming Lives, Transforming Vital Congregations and Transforming the World. There is an interesting diagram of this on the Cal-Pac website.

Our Conference includes 70,000 people, 350 local churches in Southern California, parts of Central California, Hawaii, the Pacific Islands, Guam and Saipan. Wow! I was thinking maybe we could meet in one of the gorgeous Pacific Islands instead of hot Redlands sometime.

Our "new" Bishop, Bishop Grant Hagiya, was greeted eagerly. I was impressed by his humor and clarity.

In the morning there were "Messaging Moments," talks of inspiration and ideas. The mornings also had a wide variety of music, all of it excellent and inspiring—from choirs to Bluegrass.

A lively discussion one morning engaged many people regarding "the way forward" - homosexuality, the Book of Discipline, implications for the church's future, and a wide variety of perspectives. It came to an impasse with no consensus at that time.

We had business meetings, which I must say were my least favorite. Good news was shared that our net spending did not exceed our net revenue for five consecutive years. In the afternoons we met to discuss various legislative topics and to vote and report back to the entire body to either vote or table, if the smaller groups did not agree with them. Seven recommendations passed for action, 17 resolutions passed, and there were three recommendations for rules changes that passed. Other events included honoring those who had passed on during the year, those retiring and those being commissioned and ordained.

The meetings of greatest interest to me were the mission outreaches. I especially liked the lunch on missions where we heard amazing and inspiring talks by missionary families. We learned that our Conference, along with two other conferences, are helping the Congo Episcopal Area to build the Mama Lynn Center to help rape victims. Apparently this area is known as the rape capital of the world. We heard from a 14 year old girl who raised money for three villages to get wells and clean water, and she inspired a number of others to get even more wells and clean water for villages.

Cokesbury had a bookstore set up in the Music Building, so, of course, I bought a couple of books. On the last day there was a Ministry Fair with booths and items to purchase to help those ministries. I got a necklace from the Guatemala booth and two summer dresses from the Philippines booth. There were many interesting people and projects. It was all fascinating.

I made some new friends, learned new things, and was thankful for the experience. If you have any questions, please ask me and I will share whatever I know.
