I want to share with you two more ways we can offer the compassion of Christ to those who are sick and hurting. Many of you have heard that we are in the midst of a campaign of the United Methodist Church to bring an end to malaria in the countries of Africa. This disease is a leading killer, especially among children and young mothers. There have been a couple of Golden Basket offerings (the second offering basket passed during worship on Sundays) as part of our offering toward the "Imagine No Malaria" campaign. The Mission Outreach Team will be sponsoring at least a couple more Golden Basket

Offerings in the coming months. I invite you to consider a generous gift toward this campaign. You don't need to wait for these offerings. Make a gift at any time and mark you gift "Imagine No Malaria."

Finally, I share with you that I am part of a Disaster Rebuild team going to Crisfield, Maryland, to help with the rebuilding of a small, poor community from the Hurricane Sandy disaster. Friends, as we serve together in the coming months and years, we can continue to respond to Jesus' call by saying we saw the sick, hungry, homebound, homeless, and hurting and we offered help and hope.

Andrew Nelson Birchwood Camp 2014 Chugiak, AK – United Methodist Church

This year, I was offered a position as a counselor for an internship at a youth camp in Alaska called Birchwood Camp. This was my first real camp-like experience that I have ever attended (and it was in Alaska!). It was the best summer experience of my life. I will always remember the friends I made and the people I met. I was asked to be a counselor for 6.5 weeks, from the end of May to the beginning of July.

Being in Alaska for the first time was an amazing and fun experience. I really enjoyed seeing glaciers, all the campers and kids at each of the four camps, and going to a church called ACF, which was a church focused on mission work and had an amazing worship band.

I also loved being a counselor. As a counselor, I was in charge of 5-10 kids along with working with another counselor. The kids were awesome, and the games we played were really fun too. We played group games like ultimate Frisbee, capture the flag, zombie tag, and even a game we all called the Crazy Olympics. This was a game consisting of a bunch of fun, and sometimes funny, challenges and activities that were focused on friendship, trust, cooperation, and team building. Every night at each camp, there was worship and devotion time, where all of us would sing gospel and worship songs for 30 minutes, and then for the remainder of the time we would have a special message for the day, like "Jesus is Teacher", or "God loves us". We would then read Scripture and then proceed into Bible study before cabin time.

I also hiked a mountain (which was a blast!) with two other interns that were my age. I was able to go to Seward, Anchorage, the Native Heritage Center, Chugiak, Chugach State Park, and a few other small towns that were around these places. Overall, I have grown closer to God. I was able, throughout the camps, to see God in every person, whether they were an adult or a child. This was due to the relationships that were forged throughout the weeks of camp. I look forward to returning as a counselor next year and continuing this amazingly fun adventure that I had in Alaska at Birchwood Camp.
