RICK'S RAMBLINGS

Jesus is the Light of the World

I have been watching the news like many of you and learning of the tragedies around the world: Orlando, San Bernardino, Nice, Istanbul, flooding in West Virginia, and fires in Santa Clarita. I am saddened, angered, and worried. To add to this, we have public figures and politicians stirring up our fear and anger by emphasizing the darkness in the world, villainizing people different from us, and pointing out only what is wrong and what will hurt us in the world. The more we allow this rhetoric to build our fear the more we are discouraged, the more we are controlled by others, the more we turn away from others as our potential helpers and look to others as the problems in our lives and the world.

Jesus said in John 8:12, "I am the light of the world, those who follow me will never walk in darkness." The times that Jesus lived in were certainly as dark as any in history. The Roman Empire was in control of much of the world including Israel. Hunger and pain was rampant, people were poor, and their futures looked bleak at best. But Jesus assured the people that darkness in their lives of the world was not the true ruling force or holding them down. Jesus came to bring hope of God that was light, the love of God that would never fail His creation and Humanity, no matter how much the evil of the world tried to control and dominate.

I just saw Polly Shepherd, a survivor of the fatal shooting at Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Charleston SC. At the core of her words to the convention audience was that she had forgiven Dylan Roof the shooter who killed her pastor and friends. Polly said that one can't heal with hate in their heart. She demonstrated that God's love never fails. By living in God's love one lives in the light of Christ and expresses that hope can be. President George H.W. Bush introduced the country to Points of Lights in 1989. Calling Americans to become a point of light, to volunteer to help others, and better the community they live in. I believe this came from President Bush's faith. He was inviting all to be the light that would shine in the darkness and overcome it.

Friends, yes there is much in life that makes us hurt, angry, fearful. But I believe that for us to overcome and to move forward beyond the darkness of our society, we need to embrace the light of the world for strength and hope and not follow the way of those who want to preach fear and hopelessness. We know that that God's love never fails and let us live that never failing love so we will shine together.


