Rick's Ramblings

The Long Journey Home

I made the journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem during my two trips to Israel. Neither time did I make the trek in a continuous trip, and in neither by walking as Mary and Joseph would have done. Mary and Joseph would not have taken a direct route. The region of Samaria would have caused them to detour to the east somewhat because the area would have caused them to be unclean. I can tell this journey is not smooth and fast going by bus in a more direct route. For Mary and Joseph, the ninety-eight or so miles they journeyed would have been arduous, unsafe, and long. Food would have been hard to come by and add to that Mary was pregnant. Contrary to what many believe, it is unlikely they had a donkey to ride on (the Bible doesn't tell us they had one). This travel would have taken them at least a week to make.

So why make the trip? The Roman Government required it for tax enrollment purposes, and one could not do this in the town one lived but only in the town of one's male ancestors' birth. For Joseph, this would have been King David's hometown of Bethlehem. Besides a couple of short jaunts to Jerusalem to fulfill religious ritual obligations, Mary and Joseph thought their travel days would be over and they could settle in Bethlehem. This would not be the case. Warned in a dream, Joseph gathered the family and headed to Egypt to keep Jesus safe from the murdering tirade of King Herod. Finally, Joseph was told once again in a dream from God that the coast was clear, and that they could return to Nazareth to raise their son Jesus. These are the traveling adventures of Mary, Joseph and Jesus we read about during the Christmas and Epiphany seasons.

In our reading of these stories we tend to gloss over them to lift up the birth of God's son Jesus that brings hope and joy for us and for all the world. We sing inspiring carols of Christmas, decorate our homes, including our Church home, make scrumptious holiday goodies, watch sentimental Christmas shows and movies and much more to highlight this season of joy. What we tend to miss are the struggles, dangers, uncertainty, fear, and loneliness of a couple dealing with the unjust requirements and paranoid fears of those in power. What we don't always see in this story is the unwavering faith and trust a young couple has in God to watch over them in their travels, not only on the road, but to provide for their needs of food and shelter and to protect them when a ruler is so afraid of their child that his life is in danger. God brought this unassuming family back home to raise their son in that same faith and trust. They would be a part of preparing him for his journey as God's Son to walk his journey home to the cross and resurrection with hope and trust.

Like Mary and Joseph, we will find ourselves on a journey of faith where we will, as individuals and as a Church family, be confronted with the ups and downs of life. The hurts and pains we don't ask for and the responsibilities and callings challenge us. This Christmas and Epiphany let us read in this story a faith and trust in God to walk with us on our journey. To follow in the walk of Jesus that strengthens us is to live in hope, peace and love so that we can know the joy of this season and offer it to others who continue to struggle on their journey of life and faith.


