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# Rick's Ramblings

FUTURE IS NOW! Plans for the Present and Future

Since our retreat in the middle of May, many have asked about the results. What are we going to be doing? Where are we headed? So I felt it was appropriate that I share the results of our Mission/ Ministry Vision Retreat. I need to get to the two major Ministry Projects that we will be seeking to move forward during this year. There are also already three areas we are currently doing well that we would like to expand. But I want to set the context for all this first.

**First:** Some may be concerned as we move forward with this process that we will be eliminating some awesome programs, ministries, and mission we are currently doing. That is not the intent. We will continue to do well and expand what is working well and where we are serving people and people still have a passion for it. What we will discover is that many of these programs, ministries, and mission will fall within our Key Strengths and only grow stronger as ministries.

**Second:** The purpose of our study and retreat was to discover where our strengths and passions as a congregation lie. Then we can begin to discover and develop major Mission/Ministry Projects that we scan accomplish to make our congregation stronger. These will be the major focus points. We will invite and recruit teams to develop plans, goals and recommendations to accomplish these objectives.

Third: The Keys are in order of importance for Strong Healthy Congregations. The first six are relational keys, the second six are functional keys. If you could do one thing well, it is the first key; then the second, then the third, then the fourth, etc. The hope is to get to the point where the congregation is able to be strong in eight of the twelve keys, but be at peace if we are able to be strong in only one key at this point in time.

#### Now let me be clear. If one of the first four keys is not one of our strengths, let us be at peace and focus on one of the others that is. The spillover effect is that we will bring up one of the others to the point it is becoming one of the strengths later.

As proposals are created, the plan is to present them for the congregation to have input, to embrace and then to participate in the process and projects. You will notice as I list the Twelve Keys below that we are not as strong in some of the areas as we would like to be. There is nothing to worry about because as we grow stronger our strengths in areas of weakness will gain attention. By definition of Kennon Callahan, author of the Twelve Keys to an Effective Church, a strength is a score of 8, 9, 10. But what the group who came to the retreat decided was that we would include those that were 7.5 or above. I will list the Keys in one sentence descriptions and the score for each. I know my explanation will raise other questions, so feel free to contact me or come to Church Council to help get your questions raised. The goal is for all of us in this church family to be a part of the process.

#### Twelve Keys: Our Scores

**Specific Mission Outreach:** This is a specific mission that can be measured, where persons are served directly i.e. An Afternoon Outreach for elementary age children. It is a mission to persons outside the church. **Score:** 6.5

**Shepherding/Visitation:** Visiting with a sense of grace and peace to the homebound, the sick, and first-time visitors. This includes both those in the congregation and the community. **Score: 6.4** 

Stirring, Helpful Worship: Worship has warm

moments like welcoming and helpful preaching. 40% of the service is music. The service should feel balanced. **Score: 7.5** 

Significant Relational Groupings: These are small groups that are formed around life stage, personal interests, community hurt & hope. They are warm, welcoming, inclusive, shepherding, and open. They are either formal or informal. A congregation doing well always looks to form new groups. Score: 7.1

**Strong Leadership Team:** The team achieves our key objectives, has capabilities and passion for the projects and ministries. It encourages and supports others and encourages creativity. **Score: 6** 

Solid Decision Process: There is a strong sense of openness and ownership in our decision process. There is a sharing of the spirit of integrity, mutual respect, and trust with one another within a simple structure based on our key projects and ministries. Wise, thoughtful decisions need to be made in relation to our key projects and ministries. Score: 6.1

**One Major Program:** Contrary to the Mission Outreach itself, a major program begins with serving people within the congregation, i.e., the Christmas Party. A program is the best in the community. Leaders are both person and program centered. A program has some connection with our one major mission outreach. **Score: 6** 

**Open Accessibility:** This is about facility in major traffic patterns, easy in and out of property movement. Buildings share "people

accessibility" and people are warm and inviting. Score 6.9

**High Visibility:** There is excellent visibility of the facility, helpful signs and seasonal points of interest. There is excellent communications visibility (internet, Facebook, tweeter) within the congregation and with the community. There is

excellent people visibility doing worthwhile community projects. **Score: 6.1** 

Land, Landscaping, & Parking: This has to do with sufficient usable land for immediate and future needs, ample parking for all services and activities, landscaping that contributes to a good first impression that is warm, welcoming open and spacious. Score: 8.2

Adequate Space & Facilities: There is adequate space & facilities for present and future mission, shepherding, worship, groupings, and programs. Balance is kept with facilities and land, landscaping and parking. Facilities are well maintained to create a warm first impression of welcome. Score: 8

**Solid Financial Resources:** A congregation of generous people makes available all six sources of giving (spontaneous gifts, major community Sundays, special planned giving, major project, annual giving, enduring gifts). It encourages and celebrates generous giving. **Score: 7.7**

As you can see, we have one relational key (worship) and three functional keys (land, adequate space and financial resources) as our key strengths. Out of this, the group that participated in the retreat selected two major ministry projects based on our strengths to develop and accomplish this year: **1. Developing a sign at the driveway entrance. 2. Planning and doing a Musical Revival for the community**.

The Church Council and Leadership team will invite and recruit the teams that will develop the plans and proposals for these projects. The teams will be encouraged to stretch their creativity (start with the crazy and scale back as needed to fit our congregation), to include as many persons as possible in the planning, and then execute the projects.

There are two areas in which we are currently active and would like to expand for the coming year. These are Vacation Bible School and Worship. There were

other ideas for consideration that will be held for future reference as we get our stated projects in place. Those who have a passion for these ideas will want to take leadership for them. Church Council will continuously keep all this before us and monitor progress.

Finally, I want to ask all to lift up our Ministries and Projects in your prayers; pray for leaders and team members who will be guiding us, pray for the people whom God sends us to serve and welcome and pray for yourself as you discover the passion and joy to be a part of our Ministry as God's Church moving forward. Remember, the real goal for all of this is to share the word of Hope, Grace, Peace and Love of God in Christ to all we serve and who come to us.

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
