## Rick's Ramblings

### The Way Forward

The Methodist Episcopal Church and the Evangelical United Brethren Church united to form the United Methodist Church. That was fifty years ago. We are still wrestling with how to continue forward. The last General Conference (worldwide, every four years) was marked by much debate, hurt and anger about changing the Book of Discipline (our book of rules) regarding human sexuality. A final appeal was made to the Council of Bishops. Our bishops lead the regional Conferences throughout the world. They are not able to change the rules. But they can move the body to continue in discussion or form special task forces to deal with important issues.

This issue of human sexuality and how to welcome and treat the LGBTO community and clergy has been one that has been an anchor around the church as we attempt to be faithful to God's calling to bring the Gospel into the World, to bring healing and hope to all God's people, to speak out in the spirit of the Peace of Christ to bring an end to violence, and to be the love of Christ. For over thirty years this serious issue has Attempts have been made to been debated. "sweep it under the rug" resulting in rejection, and causing hurt and fracture to the United Methodist Church. We are one of the last mainline denominations to come to some resolution on this matter. In part this is because we want to remain a connected Church body. But if we are to continue to seek the guidance of the Scriptures and be faithful to God's command through Christ "to love one another as I have loved you", then we must be willing to come together and listen and act in a way of care and love as painful as this process may be.

In that spirit, a group of youth and young adult members of the 2016 General Conference made an appeal to the Council of Bishops to form a task force to explore the options. The Church can move forward if changes were to be made (or not) to our Book of Discipline regarding human

sexuality. The Council of Bishops had the option to decline the appeal and let stand resolutions not to change. The Council of Bishops, by majority vote, accepted the appeal and appointed a 32-member task force of laity, clergy, and persons representing United Methodist Churches all over the world. The task force has become known as "The Way Forward". The Bishops also called for a special General Conference to meet February 23-26, 2019, a year early, to deal with this one topic and the recommendations.

After two years of work, The Way Forward task force has presented three recommendations for the General Conference to consider. The full description of each of these recommendations will not be presented to the general public until this July after all regional Conferences will have had their annual meetings. The bishops know the details and they have offered one that they are recommending for action by the General Conference next year. What I present below was reported by the Council of Bishops after their meeting in early May, 2018. The text (in part) is as follows:

Having received and considered the extensive work of the Commission on a Way Forward, the Council of Bishops will submit a report to the Special Session of the General Conference in 2019 that includes:

- All three plans (The Traditionalist Plan, The One Church Plan and the Connectional Conference Plan) for a way forward considered by the Commission and the Council.
- The Council's recommendation of the One Church Plan.
- An historical narrative of the Council's discernment process regarding all three plans. Rationale: In order to invite the church to go deeper into the journey the Council and Commission have been on, the Council will make all the information considered by the Commission and the Council of Bishops available to the delegates of the General Conference and acknowledges there is support for each of the three plans within the Council. The values of our global church are reflected in all Three plans. The majority of the Council recommends

the One Church Plan as the best way forward for The United Methodist Church.

Guided by the mission, vision and scope document, the bishops agreed to recommend the One Church Plan. This plan provides conferences, churches, and pastors the flexibility to uniquely reach their missional context while retaining the connectional nature of The United Methodist Church.

The One Church Plan allows for contextualization of language about human sexuality in support of the mission; and allows for central conferences, especially those in Africa, to retain their disciplinary authority to adapt the Book of Discipline and continue to include traditional language and values while fulfilling the vision of a global and multicultural church.

This plan also encourages a generous unity by giving United Methodists the ability to address different missional contexts in ways that reflect their theological convictions. The One Church Plan removes the restrictive language of the Book of Discipline and adds assurances to pastors and Conferences who due to their theological convictions cannot perform same-sex weddings or ordain self-avowed practicing homosexuals.

The Council's discernment process was guided by the over-arching desire to strategically help the General Conference do its work and to honor the General Conference's request for the Council to help the church find a way forward.

Commenting on the statement of the Council of Bishops, Ken Carter, newly installed president stated: "With convicted humility, bishops want to be pastors and shepherds of the whole church in order to maximize the presence of a United Methodist witness in as many places in the world as possible and with as much contextual differentiation as possible."

As with the whole Church I know this issue is personal and difficult for all of us. As we move toward the 2019 General Conference and beyond we will have opportunity for discussions. As details become available we can share what all this means for the United Methodist Church globally and for our


