## RICK'S RAMBLINGS

#### **EASTER FLOWER**

One of my favorite Easter devotional writers is J. Barrie Shepherd, a Presbyterian pastor and author of countless poems and devotional writings. In his book *Faces at the Cross* he writes an interesting short piece entitled "Hope Weed".



Our Christian symbols seem, at times, not quite appropriate to the meaning that they bear. For instance, take the Easter lily, white and fragile sign of resurrection. Rare, its graceful silent trumpet greets the light of March or April only under glare of florists' lamps, unnaturally bright. You never find them in the open air before July.

A better flower for Easter Day would be, as every angry gardener knows, the dandelion, seeded by the gay abandoned wind that, as it listeth, blows. No matter how we weed out every stray, digging as deep, the root still deeper goes. And when, at last, we quit and go away, the rain falls, and a host of fresh bright foes stands resurrected, and the garden glows.

Yes, the resurrection is glorious but it really happened in a messy time with oppression, brutality, and more. Do we dress up Easter so much that we forget that the time and events weren't pretty? The followers of Christ struggled and were afraid for their lives and not sure what to do next. What the dandelion reminds us of is its tenaciousness; it is renewed life even after death.

Our faith is not always pretty. But with the risen Christ we will receive the spirit of endurance and strength to face the struggles of life and to persevere in living in the hope and calling of Christ. Our faith isn't about how it looks, but what the results are and how effective we are in living in the way of Christ. It is about the life it gives which brings a joy to our faith.

#### Church Budget Set for 2016

At their January meeting, the Church Council approved the operating budget 2016 recommended by the Finance Team. The budget approved is \$328,544 which is a 2.7% increase over 2015. This is in part due to a building maintenance increase and the running of the office and finances. Beside this, we have grown the amount for the ministries of the church. All this allows us as a church family to offer ministries that serve our congregation and community to live out our vision of Christ to the world. To meet this budget, we as a congregation of faith will remain faithful in our giving and participate where possible in the other fundraising events.

Through our budget last year, we touched lives and served our congregation and community and met our obligations except for meeting our full United Methodist Denominational giving to our Conference. Our hope is to meet all our giving needs for 2016 and, with everyone's generous giving of gifts and time, we will continue to offer the grace and hope of Christ in real, helpful ways.
