

We will learn/review:

Lectio Divina is Divine Reading of a line or two of inspirational writing, particularly the scriptures, combined with journaling. It brings the scriptures alive and present in our lives.

Centering Prayer is a simple method of Christ-centered silent prayer, a renewal of an ancient Christian contemplative practice that has been updated for our time. It can lead to a deeper prayer life, personal healing, spiritual transformation and a closer union with God.

Journaling or writing from within brings out profound thought straight from the inner kingdom.

Focusing in the scattered and busy energy of modern life leads to clarity. We will learn several techniques, including the 4 points of Aikido.

Breath control is one of the time honored techniques to still the mind. We will learn several. You will find the fractured and scattered mind come to one point, be still and be open to the Divine.

Motion and focus with body movement is a joyous physical way to still the mind. We will find a quiet mind in walking and in rhythmic movement.

Guided meditation is diving into that Inner Kingdom. You will have the opportunity to experience a guided meditation and to write one for your personal use.

Servant Volunteer of the Month for January/February Mariene Oaks

This month I have the honor to share a bit about myself. I was born in Pennsylvania and lived there through first grade. We moved to California in 1947 before there was a highway system. We drove through towns and neighborhoods and stopped at amazing attractions like the Painted Desert and the Petrified Forest (big in those days).



We settled in Whittier, a little Quaker college town back then. As it turned out, my education in Pennsylvania put me ahead of the other students, so through 5th grade I spent a lot of time each day teaching a table full of slower students. In 6th grade I was in a split 5th/6th grade class. The teacher put me in charge of the 5th graders most of the day every day.

In high school I became the first work experience student in California, and I taught a 2 hour English Orientation class of freshman 3 days a week. The principal took me around various places to have me speak and to show off his idea of having students try out their planned profession to make sure it was a fit. When I graduated from Cal High, I received the Teacher's Scholarship.

I received a Lifetime Teacher's Credential for Junior High through Junior College. I taught various things from Home Ec to Art to History, both American and World, and sometimes reading. Eventually I received a Masters of Divinity and doctorate in Religious Studies.

I had two wonderful children, Christopher and Linda. We lived in Huntington Beach. My husband had an aneurism in the main artery in his brain on Christmas of 1976. Suddenly my entire life changed.

It was suddenly apparent to me that I was to go into the ministry, and I was ordained in May 1978 by The Community Church with 3 of my mentors officiating, Drs. William Parker, Rocco Errico and Marcus Bach. I moved to Hawaii and founded The Community Church of the Islands. I also had a talk radio program that reached all of the islands, and was privileged to participate in many aspects of the community. Several years later I was called to Colorado, then Palo Alto and finally Fullerton. While at Fullerton the Rabbi and I began a Police Chaplin program, I was an officer and then President of the Ministerial Association and involved in the community in many ways. Our beautiful 1909 church was damaged by the 1987 earthquake and we met in Temple Beth Tikvah for 26 months while it was restored. We raised a quarter of a million dollars for the restoration in a myriad of ways from a concert with Della Reese as the headliner (she donated her services!), to celebrity auctions, to bake sales, etc.

One amazing thing in Fullerton also was that Gilbert came into my life. He is the calmest, most encouraging and supportive man! Between us we have 4 children, 9 grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren. We have been married 34 years.

While at Fullerton, I was on the Asilomar leadership team to put on our yearly 2 week retreat at Asilomar in Pacific Grove. It changed my life in many ways. Probably the most amazing thing happened put me in a sort of jet stream that led me where I never thought of going. Someone came back stage and said they had a phone call from New York that 2 Russian healers were stranded with no money—do something they said. So I went on stage, told everyone (1,200+ people), and led a prayer. People started streaming backstage asking to take up an offering, which had already begun! We ended up with enough money for 2 roundtrip tickets from New York to LAX and \$600 spending money for them. In our living room in Fullerton we had Evelina, a major spiritual leader in Russia, and her KGB interpreter, Galina. Together we watched Yeltsin on the tank, communism crumble all with real-time faxes from Moscow. They attended our church and said there was no joy like that in Russia and urged me to come to teach. The end of October and beginning of November, 1991, we taught in St. Petersburg and Moscow. It began a totally miraculous series of happenings that included my sermons on radio Moscow every Friday night to 60 million people for 3+ years, many teaching trips all over Ukraine, Crimea and Russia, also Armenia, commendation from Moscow City Council, approval by Yeltsin, deep connections to thousands from the poorest to the most powerful. I wrote a dozen or more books and had them translated to use as texts. Several are on Amazon in English. Maybe someday I will share in person with you more of my amazing adventures

We were on the fringes of this church for some time. In the late 90's I met David French at a workshop I led at the center Pat Proud and her mother, Lucy, founded. When Pat began writing and producing spiritual plays here, I sometimes made costumes. It was after Pastor Rick came that we became regular attenders. Over 5 1/2 years ago I started our Prayers and Squares ministry. For 4 years I've been a lay delegate to CalPac, which makes me a member of all committees. I am active in UMW and am beginning my second year as President. I have led 3 retreats for UMW. It has been my honor to preach several times when Pastor Rick has been away, and I do love to preach. I invite you to explore my blog www.spiritualquest.today. It is amazingly read by thousands of people all over the world.

There have been 3 themes in my life: spirituality, creativity and service. As far back as I can remember, I have had personal experiences of/with God. It has been part of my calling to move people from knowing about God to knowing God. I am thankful that I am able to serve here with you, my spiritual family.
