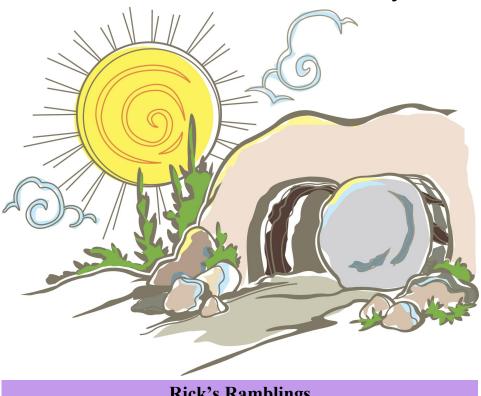

Starting a New Year

Starting a New Year? It's late April and January 1, is in the rear-view mirror. The Jewish New Year, Rosh Hashanah, isn't until September and the next Chinese New Year isn't until late January 2023. So, what New Year is this? I would call it the New Year of the Resurrection. From Revelation 21:1-7 come these words: "Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth: for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more... I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, 'See, the home of God is among mortals: He will dwell with them; they will be his peoples, and God himself will be with them, he will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away'...Then he said to me, "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning, and the end. To the thirsty, I will give water as a gift from the spring of the water of life."

For seven weeks after Easter, we are in the time of Resurrection, the time of life. I reflect on this time as a time of joy and hope even amid the struggles of my life. We have come through two years of Covid 19 and the variants that have disrupted our lives and caused pain in so many ways. We have witnessed the division of our nation due to political, social, and racial differences. We are feeling the effects of the destruction and death due to an unjust war raging on a people for no other reason than a want for power, selfishness, and greed. But the

Resurrection is a sign and a promise of life over death, light swallowing up the darkness, hope in the midst of despair, joy enveloping sadness.

As I reflect on this time of Resurrection, I am reminded of what God has done and is still doing for me. I am strengthened in the belief and assurance that God has not and will not abandon me in my times of darkness. That God will always enfold me with God's grace and forgive me where I have not been a light of love. This empowers me in my faith to live in the way of Christ's love for others.

In the next several weeks as we come to the day of Pentecost (June 5^{th}) I invite you to take the time to reflect on the New Year of Resurrection for your life. What this new life in Christ means for you. The path this reflection will lead you. What God calls you to do in the name of Christ's love. Where you need to forgive and be reconciled. How you can serve.

As we bask in the light of this Resurrection let us also remember that the New Year is every day, every month all year long.

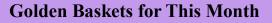
