Rick's Ramblings

We Are Family

Sister Sledge, the all-female Disco, Pop, R&B group, had a 1979 hit song "We are Family" that landed #1 on the R&B charts and #2 on the Pop Charts. The chorus lyrics focused on the group's identity not only as all female, but also as four sisters. "We are family I got all my sisters with me, we are family everybody get up and sing." They were family and they wanted to bring everybody else along as family to enjoy and to move to the music. Be happy being together in love and life. This song became the theme song for the Pittsburgh Pirates, Major League Baseball team, during their title run and eventual World Series victory in 1979.

We are Family is a concept and an ideal that brings hope and thoughts of inclusion, care, love, encouragement, strength, forgiveness and much more. Family is how God conceived humanity from the story of creation, to calling Moses to divide up the twelve tribes of Israel found in Exodus, to Jesus feeding the 5,000 by having them sit in groups of 50 – 100 people (family groupings). God wanted humanity, us, to live in families so that we could care for and comfort one another, support each other in difficult times, and rejoice together in the joys of life. For God, family wasn't just immediate blood relatives. Family was any grouping of people who come together to live out God's love and care for one another. This is the vision God holds for us to help bring about the fruition of God's Kingdom.

It is not an easy task to live out this reality of family. As we think of our own families, even families that we call functional, struggle to be cohesive, strong, and caring. Each individual has their own priorities as to what's best for the family and for themselves. There are times of greed, power struggles and rejection. Then when the siege from outside the family presses in, economic struggles, death of a loved one, illnesses, bullying and hate from outside the home and more. These can make family life at its best to know the joys, the love, and the hope for the future difficult to achieve. These are the ups and downs of a nuclear family.

Imagine how the understanding and the creation of family grows as such in our church family. The dynamics of how to care for and grow a family strong are still the same. Communication, understanding, sacrifice for one another, knowing that we aren't going to agree with one another, but also knowing and loving each other and forgiving one another, will keep the bond strong. In the traditional marriage vows I have a couple repeat after me, "In the name of God, I Bob/Sue, take you Sue/Bob to be _, to have and to hold from this day forward, for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, until we are parted by death. This is my solemn vow." These vows are done in the presence of God and they are done with God at the center. God and His love for us, and our love for God and one another, is what will make any family work and get through the difficulties of life.

Our Church family has spent a number of months communicating and trying to understand how to be a family and expand our family to be an all-inclusive family. It has been a struggle at times, hurt feelings at others, disagreement and misunderstanding as well. We have fractured the relationship with some of the family members as we have come to the hopeful decision to be a Reconciling

Congregation. It is time to offer forgiveness and seek reconciliation with one another. Now is the time to keep communication lines open and lean on the strength of God. To walk in the loving way of Christ means that we learn what this way of being family is for us, and how we are to live it out. I pray that we take our vows to being in a committed loving

relationship as seriously as the ones I ask of couples when they enter into a marriage relationship. "I (<u>put in your name</u>) take you, (<u>put in all other persons' name in our Church family</u>) to be my brother and sister to have and to hold from this day forward, for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, in agreements and disagreements, to love and to cherish, until we are parted by death. This is my solemn vow to you and to God." This in part is, I believe, how our family will grow in strength and numbers.

Amen (So Be it)!


