Rick's Ramblings

Through The Eyes of a Visitor

In the Gospel of Matthew 25: 35, Jesus says "I was a stranger and you welcomed me." When we read this verse we can understand "stranger" in different contexts. One context could mean immigrants or another context could be a stranger or new person who finds his way to our doors to seek help or meet a specific hurt or need. Another context closely related is one who comes to worship with us for the first time.



What do first time visitors see as they come to our church? Do you remember what you saw, what you encountered? In listening to your stories and journeys over the last couple of

months I often heard that you found this congregation friendly and welcoming. Do you remember what made it welcoming, what made you feel at home and this was the place to be? The longer we are part of a church family and participate in a congregation, we remember feeling welcomed. We are at home but we forget why, and many times we wonder why people don't stay once they visit and can't feel the welcome we have felt.

We no longer have the lenses of a visitor. We know where the Hillside Room is and how to get there for fellowship time. We know the ways to get into the church and find the Sunday School classes. We know how to follow along in the bulletin (what is coming next), how to turn and find the page in the hymnal. We have our friends, to whom we talk and catch up. But what do visitors see?

Since Sally and I are still newbies and have the lenses of a newcomer, let me share some of what a visitor sees and feels. I also have years of experience and research that support the feelings of newcomers. When we drive up to the church, we have been doing it so long we have a sense of where the driveway is, but do we really see it? "I saw you a stranger and welcomed you." As we offer the Grace and Love of Christ let this be one of our tenants as the body of Christ.

Pastor Rick's Ramblings continued

Sometimes you drive past at 45 – 50 mph and you have to make a U-turn. Do visitors see our sign? Not if they want to see the car in front of them when they brake. We drive in and walk up to the front door. When we see our friend do we not stop to say "hi", give a hug, catch up? All good acts. But when we stop in front of the door to do this and congregate



around the visitor table we may be preventing a newcomer from being greeted by our New Visitor Greeter and make getting into church like running an obstacle course. When all this happens, the anxiety level rises and becomes a negative check for the visitor.

When we worship do you notice your neighbor who might be worshiping for the first time struggle with following along with the bulletin? Do you take the time to help them even if it means moving a few chairs to sit next to them? If a visitor struggles to worship, is it that they have a hard time praising God and feeling the joy of worship around them? During our time of welcome do we look for the stranger among us (within our sitting area) and greet him or her? When people know they are welcomed and embraced it means that they will find home. If a visitor is sitting near you at the end of worship do you ask if they want to join you for a time of fellowship? There they can meet more family members in a relaxed friendly setting. If the family has children do you make sure an usher or greeter helps them find where our Sunday School is?

Most first time visitors will leave out the north doors and go home and we wonder where they have gone. You will find me most of the time at that door greeting. This way I will have at least one contact with them. If they go out the south door more likely one of you is leading them to the Hillside Room to meet other folks. We don't want people to have to use GPS to find the Hillside Room. We have uplifting helpful opportunities for newcomers to participate in, but if they can't find their way to the breezeway they will never know about them.

How are we doing? Are we hindering or welcoming newcomers as they find their way to the church? Bishop Robert Schnase, United Methodist Bishop in the Kansas area, wrote *Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations.* The first chapter is "Practicing Radical Hospitality". It is about welcoming the stranger as if Christ has welcomed the stranger.



Schnase writes, "Churches that practice Radical Hospitality don't merely have a Hospitality Committee. They make Christian invitation and welcome a vital part of the culture of the church, an expectation of every member and of every Sunday School class, Bible study, choir, and mission team. Every ministry invests serious time to plan, pray for, invite, and receive newcomers, and to teach current members how to be more welcoming." One of the major goals of the Welcome and Outreach Team is to mentor and teach us ALL to be welcoming.


