## **Prayers and Squares**

#### **Our Prayer Quilt Ministry**

In April of this year we applied to be an Official Chapter of the International Prayer Quilt Ministry called Prayers and Squares. We were issued our chapter number 1206, ordered some personalized labels with our church name on them, and began this exciting ministry.

We started in Room 6, but the very first meeting had to move to Room 1 as there were so many of us! The response was amazing and thrilling. In no time we had our own cupboard in the hall for supplies, which we soon outgrew. We now have 2 hall cupboards, and I wouldn't be surprised if we have to ask for another in the near future. We have had generous donations of fabric, equipment, and funds that have helped get us up and running so quickly. We also are thankful for the enthusiastic support of Pastor Rick!

In a short time Chapter 2, the Foothill United Methodist Church, adopted us, and they invited us to their next meeting. My husband, Gilbert, chauffeured Sally, Jesse, Vinya and me to the meeting. We met some wonderful women who have given away over 3,000 prayer quilts! They gave us fabric, patterns and an initial check to open a subaccount in the church account to purchase things we need such as rolls of batting. We were incredulous. We expected a warm reception, good ideas and comradery. We were extremely honored and surprised by also receiving their gifts!

Almost immediately after beginning requests started coming in, and have not let up. I joke about our sweatshop in Room 1. But really what we have is a ministry that not only inspires us but also reaches out and supports and lifts those who request and those who receive. Prayers and Squares tells everyone that it is about the prayers. The thank you notes we receive, verify this. People continually tell us that they feel the prayer power in their quilt. As of the end of September (only 5 months since the beginning), we have given away over 30 prayer quilts!

## **Early Response Team Training**

Floods! Fires! Earthquakes and More! The news is full of disasters! Have you been feeling drawn to help the survivors of these events? Some of us remember how rewarding it was to help rebuild after hurricanes Katrina or Sandy. The United Methodist Church will train you to become a member of an Early Response Team. ERTs fill a specific need in the early days after a disaster to clean out flooddamaged homes, remove debris, place tarps on homes, and otherwise help to prevent further damage, while providing a caring facilitating presence. ERTs are not a first-response group of emergency workers, nor are they recovery, rebuild, or repair teams. Under very specific quidelines, ERTs assist survivors. Training is offered to those 18 and above. While there is no upper age limit, all participants need to be in good physical health. This training needs to be renewed every 3 years. The usual time commitment is for only 3-5 days at each site. More days can be added if the group is needed.

Are you interested in being trained to help others? We will be offering a training at Murrieta United Methodist Church on Saturday, Nov. 5 from 8:30 to 5:30. The cost will be \$73 which includes: \$40 for Lunch and Manual, \$23 Background Check/Safe Gatherings on line class, and \$10 Optional ERT Tee Shirt. 
