## *Rick's Ramblings*

### *Now Thank We All Our God*

The title of my rambling this month comes from the hymn "Now Thank We All Our God" written in 1663 by Martin Rinkart. It is an old hymn some may not even know. But its words continue to help us express our thanks and gratefulness to God for His love, protection, providence and gifts for our lives. The opening line is "Now thank we all our God, with heart and hands and voices." We thank God with our whole life and being. We thank with our love for God, by serving and by praising God in worship and by our witness to others. This harkens to the greatest commandment; "love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself." (Matt. 22:39-40)

As we come into the season of Thanksgiving moving toward Advent and the Christmas season, let us not only be reminded of how we are thankful to God, as the hymn states it, "who wondrous things has done." Let us continuously be stirred by God's spirit of love to express our thanks by serving those in our community and world who are hurting and are in need. We can do this when possible by serving at the food pantry at St. Catherine's every Friday morning or offering gifts of diapers, gas cards or food for Project Touch, by serving with United Methodist Women to serve a meal for those at SMURF (Single Mothers United in Rewarding Fellowship) or by being drawn to another ministry of this congregation or a an organization in the community you have a passion to serve.

There is much to be thankful to God for, our families, friends, the beauty of nature, for shelter and food and the little things that bring joy to our lives.

As I shared, we give thanks for families and I believe this to be our church family as well. As we read in the Prophet Jeremiah, Chapter 32, God says "They will be my people, and I will be their God. I will give them singleness of heart and action..."

...I will make an everlasting covenant with them: I will never stop doing good to them." God has created us to be family, to support and encourage each other; to care and love one another; to reach out, invite and welcome strangers, the hurting, those searching and seeking help into the family. I believe this to be our calling from God, but more than that our DNA as God's children and followers of Christ. So how are we doing? When was the last time you invited someone to worship, to a fun event at the church, to serve alongside you in the community? When was the last time you spoke with someone in church when you weren't quite sure who they were or didn't know their name but said "Welcome, my name is" and "I'm glad you came to be part of the family today"? When was the last time you gave God thanks for the Church family that has walked with you on your journey of faith?

In the last stanza of the hymn comes these words: "All praise and thanks to God the Father...the Son... the one eternal God, whom earth and heaven adore; for thus it was, is now, and shall be evermore." No matter how we have acted or act now, God is with us forever and we are his children just as we are family one to another. Even during times of strife, we can live a life of forgiveness as God's children. So this week, this month, during the season of Advent and Christmas, heck even throughout the year say to one another "I thank God you are one of our church family".


