Stewardship Campaign for 2010

*Building Ministry
Today and Tomorrow*

When you hear the word **Stewardship**, what do you think of? A once-a-year event where the church and the pastor talk about giving your gifts and money? I hope not. But if so, I wouldn't be surprised. I don't think we talk about and think about **Stewardship** nearly enough. **Stewardship** has to do with how we, as Christian disciples, live our lives all the time.

During the month of February, TUMC will be sharing with the Congregation and our friends our hopes and dreams of the important ministry and missions we would like to accomplish in 2010. As we talk and think about **Stewardship** and giving of our time, prayer support, talents and financial gifts to the work of the church and the glory of God, let us remember, ponder and consider these powerful and challenging words of Jesus: **"Therefore, I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothing? But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well."** (Matthew 6: 25, 33).

Every attendee and member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on **Commitment Sunday**, February 28th. The procedure will be done in such a way that no one will feel personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

The truth is that **Stewardship** is not about money. The issue is whether we, as a church community, will allow the Spirit of God to instill in us a spirit of abundance and joy. It is about our response to what God has given us. So the question becomes, how do we respond? The answer is clear and love is the answer. At the heart of **Stewardship** is love.

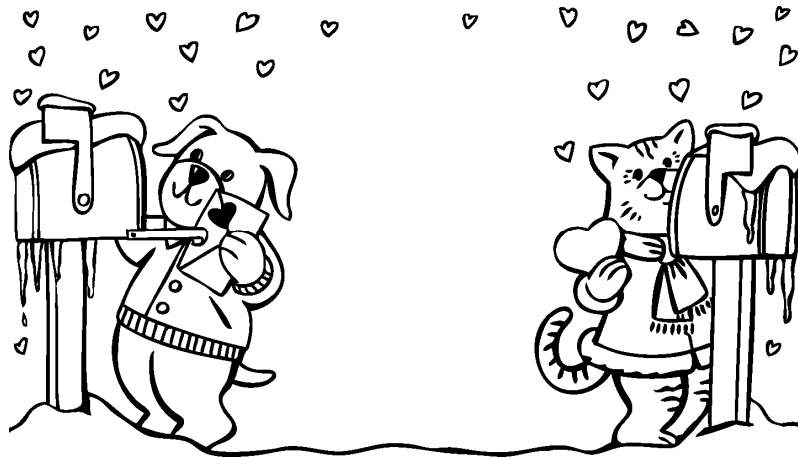
The stories of scripture make it clear that we base our stewardship – our response to God – not on something external but internal.

Good News for the Scrip Fund

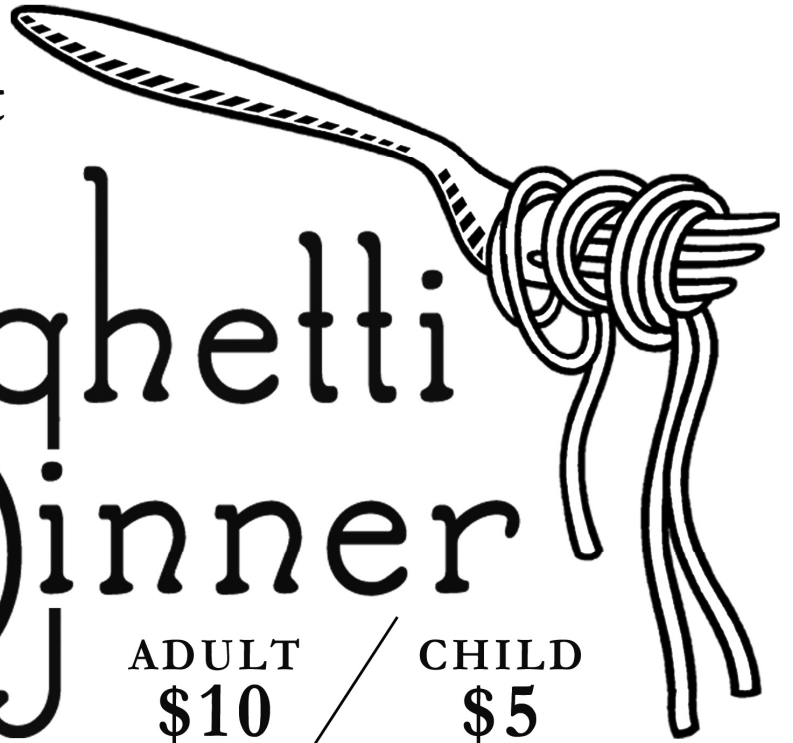
It is amazing to me how many dedicated members we have who continue to support the scrip program year after year. About 80 different families bought scrip throughout 2009 and together we raised over \$6,200. The scrip fund gives the profit it raises to the general church budget each year. With this fundraising program that was started many years ago, we have raised thousands of dollars we would not have had without it. It is the type of fundraiser that is referred to as "shopping cart" fundraising. It truly is an easy way for our church members to help raise funds for our church without any cost to them. They just shop with our "scrip" or "gift cards" rather than with cash or credit for their normal weekly purchases. Of course, we hope that everyone will participate, but it is a voluntary fundraising program that many find rewarding, since they know that some of their purchases are going to fund their church.

Traditionally, we have less money in our scrip account at the beginning of each year, so inventory is usually lower than normal. This is because the scrip fund gives the profit raised all year long to the church in the month of December. What this means in the short term is that the faster we sell scrip the sooner we can make another scrip order. In the long run, having a good amount of sales *every month* affects the year end profit in a positive way. In other words, we have raised more funds for the church in those years when more scrip was sold in the early months of the year. **SO PLEASE JOIN ME AND OTHER MEMBERS AND FRIENDS WHO USE SCRIP AND HELP US RAISE MUCH NEEDED FUNDS FOR TUMC!** Please choose to use some scrip this coming week and find out how easy it is to participate.
