If we discovered a magic magnet that would draw outsiders to our church, what would they find when they arrived? What would be their first impressions?

We naturally want our church visitors to have a good experience the first time they join us, and usually the first people they interact with on Sunday mornings are the friendly people greeting them at our visitor's table. These volunteers from our Evangelism Committee are dedicated, friendly and helpful and go out of their way to make visitors feel at home and comfortable. Some of these visitors are potential church members and constituents. But at this time we need your help to make sure that the visitors' table is staffed before the 9 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. services, each and every Sunday. We especially need additional volunteers before the 9 a.m. service. Just a time commitment once a month and a friendly attitude will do. Instructions are simple. April 25th is **Malaria Awareness Day**. Way back in March 1978, during the season of Lent in the Philippines, two men brought a man home unconscious. A doctor prescribed two kinds of medicines which had no effect because the patient could not take them. The medical director of the Methodist hospital in Manila finally diagnosed <u>Cerebral Malaria</u> which is 99% fatal. For two weeks the man was confined in the hospital, with all the tubes in his mouth, nose and arms and more than 5 packets of blood was given to him. He was clinically dead, the director said. But his three children took turns in counting the input and output (liquid/fluid) for their father, as they were told to do.

Another morning, a student nurse asked the wife, "what is his favorite song?", "What A Friend We Have in Jesus", the man's wife replied. She sang the song and prayed. The following morning the director observed that the man looked like he was getting better and, after fourteen days in a coma, the wife's sleepless nights paid off and they returned to their small house. It was Holy Thursday, the following day they went to Sandmeir UMC to attend the "Seven Last Words" service. Our Lord Almighty gave the man fifteen more years.

Update on Stewardship- Building Fund

As mentioned during services a few weeks ago, we are very pleased to announce that the request for \$23,496 to meet the annual mortgage payment during 2011 on our last remaining loan has been exceeded for the year 2011. The current commitments are for more than \$34,000. After we receive the funds for this year and are able to make our annual mortgage payments for 2011, the additional funds received will be collected and held by the Church to begin paying next year's payments. TUMC has an outstanding history of building and funding our beautiful campus. Since 1995, the congregation has funded over \$1.5 million in new construction and has <u>paid off</u> three loans. Now, only one loan remains with a current balance of \$140,900 due in 7 years.


Starting in 2011, our campaign was directed towards funding our monthly loan payments of \$1,952/ month or \$23,496 per year. We want to express our appreciation for your response and willingness to support the existence of this fine United Methodist Church here in Temecula through the commitments made this year to underwriting the capital mortgage of the church. Over the next several months, I will be writing articles and providing comments on other parts of TUMC's Stewardship program and the part(s) everyone regardless of age can play in our church.
