The Tentative date is December 14th.



Stewardship for 2008

In July I wrote a letter to members of the TUMC congregation expressing appreciation to those who supported the church spiritually and financially during the first half of 2008. I mentioned, however, that some members of our congregation have fallen behind on their pledged contributions so that our overall collections were approximately \$17,000 short of the amounts actually pledged by our members. Overall, at that time, we were more than \$30,000 short of our budget for total church income.

Regrettably, this number has grown. As of the end of September, we are nearly \$40,000 behind on our budgeted income and the only way we have been able to stay solvent is to hold off making payments on our apportionment obligations to the California-Pacific Conference. Our total annual apportionment obligation for United Methodist Mission purposes is almost \$39,000 and so far we have paid only about \$10,000. We need to find a way to make up the difference.

This inability to pay has been quite stressful on Pastor Randy as well as your Finance Committee. This is a bill we are supposed to pay, but we don't have the money. As we enter into the final month of the year, please give prayerful consideration to meeting your personal commitments to the Church for 2008. As always, we appreciate your continued support for our Church through your prayers, presence and financial support to the programs and missions of TUMC.

May God bless each and every one of you.

On November 2, 2008 TUMC launched it's first Korean Language Worship service under the leadership of the Rev. Dr. Jin Tae Kwon - a retired United Methodist pastor from the Boston area. Dr. Kwon has national recognition for building a Korean congregation to 945 members, the largest in the denomination. Feeling God's call to help build up a United Methodist outreach for an estimated 5,000 Koreans in our area, Dr. Kwon approached TUMC and offered his pastoral leadership gratis. With the support and encouragement of Pastor Randy, District Superintendent Bau Dang and under the guidance of John Waddleton, Church Council chair-person and Bill Steele, Lay Leader, the Board of Trustees and the whole Church Council, TUMC formally approved Dr. Kwon's offer in October. It is important to know that we have created a "one church" model where any future Korean members will become full members of TUMC and not members of a separate congregation. We look forward to our future together as God continues to guide this congregation in a thriving ministry to the Temecula/Murrieta valley.

Stephen Ministers' Year End Report

All contact is confidential. Just call Pastor Randy and he will direct you to our group. We will try to match your need with one of the ministers that can be of the most help. And, we will stay with you until we are no longer needed.

Judy Hernandez and I will be attending a week long class in Oregon in February that will train us to become certified instructors for training other Stephen Ministers. Since this ministry works on a gender basis, woman to woman, man to man, we need one of you good dedicated men to come forward and go with us to Oregon. Registration deadline is 12/31/08. Please see me or Judy for details.

Also, we need volunteers that will be able on quick notice to prepare a meal, provide transportation, or perhaps child care in a critical situation. For you men, we need a small group, that are willing to make minor home repairs or offer advice as to what might be needed in the way of repairs. Our Dave Brostrom who visits shut-ins, needs our help in these areas. We recall Christ telling us that "what you do for the least of these you do for me". 


