A Vision of TUMC

Temecula UMC is a caring community dedicated to God's work. We welcome all by creating an atmosphere rooting in the fruits of the spirit. We are a positive, visible presence in our community and a place of comfort and peace. We provide spiritual fulfillment through worship, education, fellowship, missions, and actions. We are people of God that live out our faith every day following Christ.

Four months ago, our Church Council began a process to develop a vision statement of TUMC in the future. A vision statement is something we understand God wants us to become, to achieve; it is a seductive and bold image of what we believe to be God's view of us. While mission statements explain the purpose of an organization and guide the organization in its day-to-day operations, visions provide a sense of direction for the long term – the means to the future. Vision statements of successful organizations are generally short, clear, vivid, and concise.

Provide clear and challenging direction and purpose

Encourage unique & creative solutions

Allow continuity and avoid stutter effect of planning fits and starts

Promote interest and commitment

Build loyalty through involvement

Church council began by reviewing references on visioning and examining examples of vision statements of different corporations and churches. We shared our personal visions of TUMC, invited and gathered input from church members, then gleaned common themes from all contributions. Armed with this information, Chris Riche accepted the formidable task of crafting a draft vision statement for review by church council. Chris did a masterful job at developing a powerful and compelling draft version, which was unanimously accepted with addition of a few words. Beginning in January 2013, this vision statement, as seen below, will replace the mission statement that is used in church literature, such as the Messenger.

Gift cards for popular stores all over the country are listed, including gift cards for online stores such as Amazon.com, Shutterfly.com and Overstock.com.

You can order and pre-pay for any scrip you want from the list by filling out the order form completely and noting the exact denomination and quantity you wish to order. Turn in your completed order form to the scrip table any Sunday with a check for the total amount you owe. Of course, you can purchase gift cards at the scrip table as usual, but we might run out of some of the most popular ones if you wait until the last week before Christmas. Please Note: according to state law, gift cards sold in California never expire so we can all feel safe when giving and receiving our gift cards).


