### MISSIONS

Dan Gutierrez and Bill Hillier attended our district's Mission Festival on Saturday, April 26, 2008. It was held at Yucaipa United Methodist Church.

The keynote speaker was Rev. Martin Molina, District Supervisor for the Tijuana Area, speaking on Joint Commission Border Project. He spoke on problems that occur along our borders such as, deporting broken families back into Tijuana, children without parents and sometimes at 2-3 in the morning. Rev. Molina showed slides of their work feeding the homeless and also helping people spiritually through the Methodist faith. He stressed the importance of the U.S. and Mexico working together to solve domestic problems along our borders.

There were four workshops:

1) Met with China missionary, Kay Grimmesey.

2) Communications workshop with John and Jackie Runchel. John is the pastor at Yucca Valley UMC.

3) Rev. Brian Kent, Riverside First UMC. He spoke on missions and we all took turns sharing our experiences in mission work. Remember our Church's best investment is mission work because the person is transformed as well as the people he or she has helped. Children and young people are the best examples of life changing experiences. He put in a good word for SSP.

4) Hands-On Mission Project: Fifty backpacks were donated and each of us brought school supplies donated by our respective mission committees to fill these backpacks for Native Americans on the Northern Arizona Navajo Reservation.

We ended the day with a missions panel of four answering questions put before them by all of us. It was a day well spent for both of us.

# CRAFT FAIRE 2008



### Among Our Family Excerpt from Shirley M. Tilghman

Excerpt from Shirley M. Tilghman 19<sup>th</sup> President, Princeton University Professor of Molecular Biology—At the 2008 Commencement of Princeton University

Commenting on Princeton's 16<sup>th</sup> President, Robert Francis Goheen who "understood that he needed help in attracting and supporting black students at an institution that had not been welcoming in the past, and he therefore brought Carl A. Fields\* to Princeton as the first African American dean in the Ivy League. In a few short years, the two men transformed the landscape for students of color at Princeton, created the forerunner of the Carl Fields Center, and changed the University, as we see today, very much for the better."

\*Carl A. Fields is the older brother of Earl Fields, TUMC's Director of Music

### SANDRA HANSEN—New Co-Director




