

OUR MINISTRY OF MUSIC

The month of February is African American History Month during which the country celebrates the many contributions made to our country over the early years of this nation's history that were ignored and rarely referenced in the Chronicles of American History. Music is very high on the list of those contributions.

During the month of February, the TUMC Chancel Choir will highlight a few of the many spirituals that in large part emanated from the hearts and minds of an enslaved people yearning for the freedoms most other ethnic groups in America enjoyed. Many of the songs represented codes for survival and escape from the cruelty of slavery. Many themes were drawn from the promises and hopes learned from Bible stories, word of mouth from those who were free and the teachings of the few who learned to read. They dreamed of "a better world a 'coming".

I encourage you also to take time to listen to some of the classical and religious radio stations during the month and enjoy the richness in melody, rhythm, and message much of the music offers. One recommendation is the University of Southern California (USC) Radio Station, KUSC FM, which presents a weekly program of religious choral music from 7:00 a.m.—9:00 a.m. on Sunday mornings.

Last month, Alan Sheaffer and I were privileged to sing the inaugural performance of an anthem written by Charles Dickerson, Music Director at Rolling Hills United Methodist Church in Los Angeles, and Conductor of the Southeast Symphony Orchestra in Los Angeles, entitled "I Have A Dream".

The anthem written for chorus and orchestra incorporated the text of the now famous "I Have A Dream" speech written and delivered in Washington, D.C., by Dr. Martin Luther King at the height of the Civil Rights Movement. It was a thrilling experience to witness and be a part of the program presented to an audience of over 1,000 people at the Hall Liberty Auditorium located at the Forest Lawn Cemetery in Glendale, to honor Dr. King's birthday. The program was sponsored by Forest Lawn, and hosted by Beverly White, ABC News Reporter.

As a final note from the TUMC Chancel Choir, we remind you that we still need singers. In the words of an old spiritual, "Git On Board, Li'l Chillun, Get On Board, There's Room For Many A More".




