FROM TUMC'S MUSIC DIRECTOR

Dear TUMC Congregation,

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for the marvelous support you have demonstrated for the choir and the music we presented in support of Sunday services in 2007. Your words of encouragement, thank you notes, etc. helped immeasurably to keep me focused on trying to provide the very best in musical support available in our Temecula Valley. However there is a continuing problem that I need your help to resolve. Our choir numbers are too small.

Fortunately, we have access to members of the Temecula Valley Master Choral who respond without hesitation when I issue a call for help and as you may recall, covered the summer months while the choir was on vacation as well as helping on special occasions throughout the year. While I am grateful for this support, I want TUMC to become more independent in it's ability to make music.

As we begin 2008, I am coming to you for help in recruiting singers for the choir. As you can see each Sunday, we have a sparse group working to maintain a level of music that will enhance your worship experience, but often lacking the number of people to continue the effort over the long months ahead. We need more people.

Our strongest section right now is the Alto section. We have just added another alto/soprano who will fill some of the void left by the loss of soprano support in 2007. We are down to three men who often do double duty singing tenor and bass when the music allows. I worry each week that we will not be able to perform the music rehearsed for Sunday because of someone getting ill, or being called away for one reason or another. We need to improve our numbers this year to overcome this problem, and it cannot be done without your help.

My request therefore is that those of you in the congregation, who have some choral/instrumental music experience, take a moment to reflect on how you might assist us in filling the voids that exist. You can catch me or any of the choir members to discuss your interest, or better yet, come sit in on a Wednesday evening rehearsal. We know that people have busy schedules, and

are concerned about the level of commitment that might be involved. Let's talk about your particular needs and see if we can reach a reasonable accommodation.

Another option is for you to explore the interest of friends and family that you know enjoys singing and would possibly consider singing with a church choir. If you can direct them to our attention, it would be a great assist.

You may also have noticed that the Bell Choir has not been in evidence this season. The reason for

that is the director Edith McCollum is no longer able to lead the group. If you know of anyone who has experience in playing the Bells, and would like the opportunity to take over that responsibility and get it going again, let me or Edith know.

God Bless each and every one of you as we enter this New Year.

THE YOGA OF STILLNESS

Greetings and Happy New Year!! I would like to encourage you to join us for Yoga at TUMC on the 1st, 2nd, and 4th Thursdays of each month from 10-11:15 a.m. We meet either in Celebration Hall or Room 1. You need to bring a mat, towel and/or blanket. ALL are welcome. On any given Thursday, we have from 3 to 20 participants. Classes are taught from a very gentle perspective, and appropriate for all skill levels and fitness levels. Yoga is fun,

stress reducing, and enhancing to your overall well-being.

In November of 2007 I had the good fortune of attending a 35-hour training session at the Santa Barbara Yoga Center, and earned my certification in Yoga Therapy. I would like to give you a brief overview of what Yoga Therapy is, and how it can benefit you individually. It is the "Yoga of Stillness", or gentle, still, flowing, opening, expansive, healing, and deep surrender. Therapeutic Yoga is a remedy for the challenge of our stressful times. The practice creates a deeply rejuvenating experience through the many postures that literally hold you as you let go. It is in this deep letting go that a sweet calm can be reached, a repose that allows the innate intelligence of the body to restore balance and well-being. As our senses are drawn within, the practice becomes a meditation naturally leading to self-exploration and discovery. By moving into stillness through the layers of the body, emotions and thoughts, we find at our core a sense of quiet connection (our Divine Truth); we return to our natural condition of ease and peace. This is the essence of Yoga. Therapeutic Yoga integrates Restorative Yoga, Gentle Yoga, healing touch, breath work and guided meditation to create an environment that supports the body, mind, and spirit in the process of healing. It is used to maintain wellness or as supportive practice for those suffering with conditions such as Chronic Fatigue Syndrome, Asthma, Cancer, Aids, Arthritis, Anxiety, Panic Attacks, and much, much more. This gentle form of Yoga provides tremendous benefits for us ALL. I do incorporate a smattering of Yoga Therapy into every general, group class that I teach. However, if you are suffering from a serious condition or rehabilitating, and need a proven, validated, and holistic mode of healing, then I encourage you to explore Yoga Therapy on an individual basis. UPDATED CRAFT FAIRE 2007 REPORT

Craft Faire 2007 took place October 13, 2007 and was a success. The purpose of the annual Craft Faire is to aid our church's ministry in mission. Programs receiving funds from the Craft Faire are local, and some within our own church. Seventy five vendors made application for the Faire last year. Wet weather conditions caused a few to be "no-shows". Fees for "no-shows" were not refunded. Efforts were made to accommodate those most affected by the wet conditions, mainly outside spaces.

As of December 20, 2007 the following distribution of funds had been decided by the Planning Committee:

Habitat for Humanity - \$100.00
Poinsettias for shut-ins - \$34.47
Office supplies - \$75.00

For donations to our *Bread from Heaven* Food Pantry at TUMC and Rev. David Brostrom's Visitation Ministry, scrip was purchased for their needs.

A reserve of \$500.00 has been set aside for this year's beginning expenses. The Planning Committee met Wednesday, January 16th to decide on distribution of a balance of \$411.51. Consideration of a contribution to the General Budget of the church was discussed. Contributions to the budget have been made in the past two years.

<u>LAY SPEAKERS TO HOLD CONFERENCE EVENT</u> <u>Dr. Tom Ablin is Keynote Speaker</u>

Lay Speakers from all districts in the California Pacific Annual Conference will come together on February 23, 2008 at Wilshire United Methodist Church to celebrate in an event entitled "Lay Speakers Pray and Praise with Power". This event will feature Dr. Tom Albin, who is currently Dean of the Upper Room Chapel and Team Leader for the Program Unit of The Upper Room Ministries in Nashville, Tennessee as the keynote speaker.

Dr. Albin's studies have taken him from a one room schoolhouse in Kansas to Oral Roberts University in Oklahoma, to Fuller Theological Seminary in Pasadena, to doctoral study at Cambridge, England. He has led in areas of Evangelism and Discipleship, Lay Counseling, and College Ministries, and has taught in a Lay Academy. He has written adult and youth curriculum for the United Methodist Church and developed a program in Christian Spiritual Formation. His teaching has included courses in American Church History, Wesley Studies, Evangelism and Church Growth. Dr. Albin has also published a number of works.

In addition to his keynote address, Dr. Albin will conduct a workshop entitled "Leading Prayer - Prayer, Passion and Compassion: the Foundation for all Christian Discipleship", which will draw upon insight from the Advanced Lay Speaking course "Lead Prayer" and from the life of Jesus Christ in order to clarify what the Spirit is calling us to be and to do in our local church. Two other workshops will be offered. "Prayer and Praise through Music" will be presented by Mr. Greg Norton and Ms. Polly Salban and "Prayer Bridges Cultural Boundaries" will be presented by Rev. DiAnn Johnson and Mr. Ola Filemoni.

9:00 a.m. Sunday school (3-11) / Nursery (0-3)

Special Sunday school on-going activities include: Children's Ministries is currently providing weekly Sunday School and Enrichment Church for ages 3-11 using LiveBIG! Cokebury curriculum. Children are offered activities, lessons, crafts, music and DVD support of LiveBIG! materials. Each child is encouraged to bring home special LiveBIG! activities to work on with their parents. Parents are also offered a special Bible Study class that takes place each Wednesday night prior to the Sunday School class to discuss the lessons the children will be learning that week. First Sunday of the month, children are brought into the sanctuary during communion to sit with their parents. The idea is that they may learn and eventually partake in the rites of communion (when parents feel it is appropriate). Second through last Sunday of the month, children are brought into the service to participate in a children's sermon led by Pastor Randy.

10:30 a.m. Enrichment Church (3-11) / Childcare (0-5)

<u>Enrichment Church activities include</u>: children are asked to sit with their parents during the first part of the service (through the Children's Sermon) and then released to their teacher. The teacher finishes in the classroom with activities related to the LiveBIG! curriculum. Childcare is provided for ages 0-5 during the service.

Wednesday Family Night Activities.

The activities on Wednesday night are designed with the ENTIRE CHURCH FAMILY in mind...ages 0-100.

Wednesday night kid's activities include: *crafts, science discovery, movies or group games.* Children's Choir is also offered each Wednesday night led by several youth. The children and youth just put on a Christmas Musical called "All You Need is LOVE."

Wednesday night all church activities include: The Men's Group serves food from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. for a donation for any families interested. There on several on-going activities for adults that include: Bible Study with Pastor Randy, Disciple Bible taught by Deb Potts and Milton Takeguchi, movie and group discussion, adult choir, tech talk, scrapbooking, and we are hoping to get a tutor and mentor program between children and adults at the church. Childcare is provided from 6 p.m. to 8:45 p.m.


