PASTOR'S COLUMN

A Cup Overflowing

I have just returned from four days in Redlands with over 1,300 United Methodists from our Annual Conference. This was the first time EVER that the conference was only four days long and ended on Saturday, so that everyone could worship in their own churches on Sunday. So, the overall format was very condensed and tightly scripted to get everything done that was needed.

Fortunately, there were very few controversial motions so everything flowed smoothly. One major body of legislation were 32 Constitutional motions that will move our denomination into a truly global body of United Methodist Christians. I am happy to report that our church is rapidly expanding globally!

The total mission budget of our Annual Conference is unchanged for 2010 at \$12.9 million. After three years, a major decision was made to have all retired pastors pay a portion of their Medicare supplement insurance premium with the Annual Conference paying a subsidy of 2% per year for every year of service to the UMC. The pastor must pay the balance.

Sadly, we voted to close seven churches. There was a silent processional protest to the closure of one church and another unhappy speech was given opposing closing another church. I have never seen us close <u>seven</u> churches in one year before.

In spite of the closures; energy was good, the singing wonderful, and a warm relaxed atmosphere embraced us all as we worked for Jesus Christ.

I have printed copies of all of the paperwork and would be happy to talk more. Thanks for Doris Elder and Hope Zangl our Lay Representatives to the Annual Conference. Sandy Dodson also attended.

We missed being recognized as the District's #1 Mission giving church in 2008 by \$2.00! Yes, that's two! So let's give "our upmost for His highest" as we go forward together in Christ's spirit.

Community Rewards from Ralphs

Ralphs Shoppers: As you may know, a new rewards system is in place at Ralphs. In the past you needed to pick up a new Ralphs Card at the store to replace your old Club card. We now need to register our new Rewards Cards online at www.ralphs.com (their secure site) with our current personal information. Please pick up an instruction sheet from the Scrip table which explains in detail how to register your card and link it to our church account; account #80434. Once your card is linked then all you do is swipe your Rewards Card each time at checkout and you will earn an automatic rebate for TUMC.

If you don't have a computer please pick up the special Scan bar information sheet that you can take with you to Ralphs to scan at checkout the next time you shop. Having the cashier swipe both your new Rewards Card and the scan bar at the same time will link your Ralphs card with our church account, so that you can earn automatic rewards for TUMC each time you shop. You only have to scan the scan bar once. If you have not updated your personal information with Ralphs, then you need to call 1-800-660-9003 to do that. It is VERY IMPORTANT that your phone number is correct so that you can use it at checkout if you don't have your card with you.

Food 4 Less shoppers also need to register their cards online at Food4Less.net. Instructions are at the scrip table.

Please register your Ralphs card even if you only shop there occasionally. Every purchase counts! Thank you!


