It feels like Lent to me!

Officially Lent started Sunday March 1st but it feels like it started in the latter half of 2008! Lent is that spiritually rich time the early church set aside for deepening one's faith experience. So traditionally, Lent starts 40 days before Easter (April 12th in 2009) not counting the Sundays since each Sunday is a mini Easter anyway. Many Christians today commit themselves to some new spiritual discipline to help remember the life and passion Jesus experienced. As your pastor, I encourage each of you to either start something or stop something that will help your faith and life in Lent.

Like most of you, I celebrate Christmas with more enthusiasm than Lent. After all, who likes sacrifice, discipline and honest reflection on one's life! Yet, we are missing something if we think that life is always supposed to be that "bowl full of cherries" (strange phrase). It's easy to think that all we should know is comfort and pleasure and "hanging out."

For almost a generation now the cultural message has been "live life to the fullest," and "experience all you can be." In contrast, the Christian message is, "Follow me!" be Christ-Like, "Love God with all your heart, mind and soul."

Perhaps we need Lent more than we know to clean out the cob webs of our lives and once again take up some crosses and find God's love, in the midst of trouble instead of falsely believing that real living only happens when things are going well.

What we need is spiritual power and light! What will get us where God wants us is strength for the journey. Life becomes greatness when we follow Jesus and let compassion, understanding, and love thrive. It's God's good news that we can live every day!

Lent is a Christian observance which must be understood to be of any value. The word "LENT" comes from a variety of Anglo-Saxon & Germanic words which mean spring, a time budding with new life and hope.

Meaning of Lent continued

For Christians, Lent is not a nature celebration, but a personal discipline. It recognizes that most of us don't come naturally to spiritual exercises and growth, even less are we likely to be probing when looking at ourselves.

So, the 40 days of Lent (Sundays are not included, for they are the Lord's Day, which includes a celebration of the resurrection) are times of discipline and personal inventory.

We try to look to Christ for the standards by which we live our lives, with goals of self- giving and suffering love. With such high goals, any programmatic response seems to fall short. We have designed our Sunday Lent services to try to help us all in both discipline and introspection, and we invite you to join us in scripture reading and prayer.

Lent means a discipline in spiritual life and a time for personal inventory. There are many methods of achieving this, but none will help you until you decide to work towards it.
