

- ♦ 1-2 pages, single-spaced; Times New Roman font; 12 font size
- Inclusion of Scripture verse at end optional
- If story published previously, must include reference from which story copied
- If story involves a person(s) known to TUMC members, writer must obtain at least verbal approval (written approval preferred) of the person(s) to share the story
- This organizing committee reserves the right to edit stories for punctuation and/or spelling


