



15TH ANNUAL CRAFT FAIRE, A MISSION SUCCESS!

What began in 1997, with a small group of TUMC women completed it's 15th year with great success. The goal of the craft faire is to provide funds for TUMC programs and to help meet the social mission needs of Temecula Valley. Over the years we have become recognized as one of the best craft faires in the Valley. Vendors return year after year with high praise for our organization and quality.

The 2012 faire held October 27th, featured 68 vendors showcasing items such as wood crafts, jewelry, holiday arts, ceramics, quilts, photography, tabletop gardens, honey, children's book author, home décor, dolls & clothing, and much more. All items were handcrafted, no commercial items were allowed. Musical entertainment was provided by Melanie Tierce. A live Alpaca to pet and feed highlighted the faire.

ACTS OF KINDNESS

After the terrible loss of lives in the Sandy Hook Elementary school tragedy in Newtown, Connecticut, NBC News National and International Correspondent Ann Curry shared this idea: "Imagine if we all committed 20 Acts of Kindness to honor the lost children of Newtown." The idea evolved into "26 Acts of Kindness" to honor the students and the faculty who died in the massacre that took place that day. Perhaps you even heard about this on the news, from a radio commentator, or read an article on line or Facebook.

When I heard about this it made me think what a better world we would live in if we all took time to do acts of kindness. I started by challenging myself to do 26 Acts of Kindness this year. But my acts of kindness, for me, need to be over and above the things I do for others now, a way of taking the next step, maybe helping in a way that wouldn't normally be something I would do. And it can be simple things. One day a young woman parked next to me at the grocery store was going to take her basket back and had to leave a small child in the car. I told her I'd take it back for her. I sent a grocery store gift card to someone I knew could really use it and I did it anonymously. Giving a homeless person a \$1.00 when you come to the stop sign, visiting a retirement home and reading to the elderly, buying the person behind you a sandwich "just because" are just a few examples of Acts of Kindness. And, of course, there are large acts that we can do if we have both the time and financial means, but that isn't the point, it is simply the act of thinking about others and their needs and doing something that makes their life a little better.

So I would like to challenge each of you here at TUMC to perform 26 Acts of Kindness this year. Stretch yourself, enjoy the act of doing for someone else, be conscious about how good it makes you feel and hopefully you will continue these acts beyond just the year.

We live busy lives but taking the time to do for others will bring more reward than you can imagine.
