We have reserved a chair for you Sunday, May 20th, following worship to join us for a special luncheon provided by the Missions Committee followed by a presentation on human trafficking.

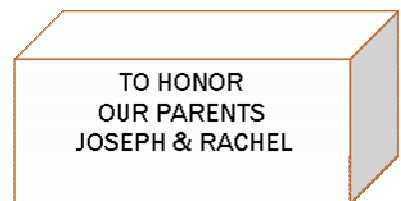
Come join us for a light lunch of soup, salad, cookies, bread and coffee, iced tea and lemonade.

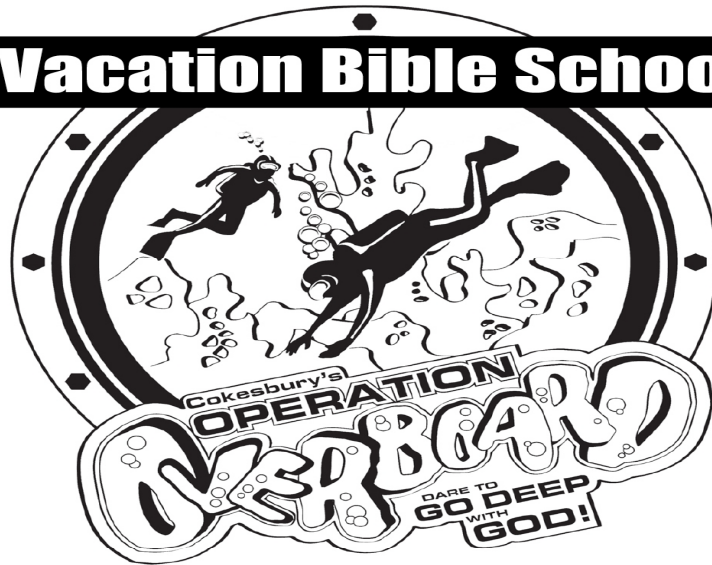

SPECIAL MISSION PROJECT

A special Mission Project for this year selected by the Mission Committee will be "CLEAN WATER AND SANITATION". A Golden Basket collection will be available a Sunday each quarter. This special project called EL PORVENIR means the future. The goal is to build 50 water projects per year in 50-60 villages; 1,000 latrines per year in 35-40 villages; 100 fuel saving smoke free stoves per year, plant 35,000-50,000 trees per year and expand operations for three new and underserved regions by 2012 (this year).

GLOBAL WATER WOES

Intelligence report warns of increasing instability because of floods and water shortages in the next 30 years. This will make it hard for many countries to keep up with growing demand for fresh water particularly in South Asia, the Middle East and North Africa. Water problems in the next decade will add to instability in countries that are important to U.S. national security.

Agriculture takes 68 percent of the water used by humans and is the biggest area where countries need to find solutions. Desalination may be economical for household and industrial use but currently isn't economical for agriculture. When water shortages continue, countries that share water basins may struggle to protect their water rights. Terrorists "almost certainly" will target water infrastructure.

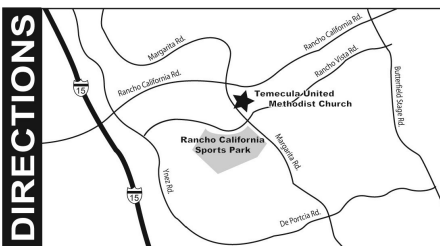
