Living on the Inside or Outside of Grace

"For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you; but if you do not forgive others, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses." Matthew 6:14.

Gospel Parallel: Mark 11:25 "Whenever you stand praying, forgive, if you have anything against anyone; so that your Father in heaven may also forgive you your trespasses."

The Tuesday morning women's Bible study recently had quite a discussion on Matthew 6:14 because it seemed to contradict God's grace. They asked for my response and I am including it in the Messenger because it also seems timely as we move towards Thanksgiving and the "season of gratitude."

When we pray, we tend to be praying to God as external to ourselves, some "other" somewhere else (in heaven). Yet, we all affirm that God is present everywhere and that includes inside of us or at the very least "with us." If we primarily relate to God in prayer as external to ourselves, Matthew 6:14-15 appears to say that our human experience of forgiving or withholding forgiveness has consequences. It almost seems that our ability to be forgiven by God depends on how well we forgive others. In fact, it feels like God's forgiveness for ourselves even depends on our own forgiving of others. If we do not forgive, then God will not forgive us. Does God's forgiveness of us really depend on the human activity of forgiving others? This certainly does not seem to make sense or seem especially "grace filled." In fact, it feels like God's action of forgiving depends more on us than it does on God!

When we pray to God aware that God is present "within" or at least "with" us, then things change. The focus of our prayer life then becomes more like a partnership with God and that power and presence simply needs to be nurtured and sustained. This feels quite different than hearing the Scripture say, "forgive or else!." When we view prayer (or life itself) as a "partnership" or a "covenant relationship" I believe this might be expressed as "living within God's grace" or "living outside of God's grace."

When we" live within grace" and experience forgiveness, we accept that we are accepted and forgiven by God. God is already active granting forgiveness to us. Living within that understanding enables us, if not frees us, to convey God's grace and forgiveness to others. What we experience in Christ we can then offer to others. What we do not experience for ourselves, cannot be shared with others. We may be only going through the motions. It's like the person who says, "I have forgiven him/her but I have not forgotten!" That's not real forgiveness.

God provides us a "bridge of forgiveness" that we can walk on between ourselves, God, and others. One might say because of our relationship with God forgiveness flows "like a river," to coin a phrase. The walk on the bridge is easy and always available. You might say God is the bridge to forgiveness. Without God, there is no bridge at all. It's all empowered by God and outside of human experience to provide for ourselves. Notice how softer the passage is in Mark. "Whenever you stand praying, forgive, if you have anything against anyone; so that your Father in heaven may also forgive you your trespasses." That Scripture emphasizes the relationship aspect with God that empowers forgiveness. The forgiveness "flows" or we have a bridge of "forgives" available. Forgiveness is a partnership and enabled by God that makes forgiveness possible for ourselves and available through us to others. That sounds more grace filled! In short, forgiveness is God's gift and made possible only through God. We can't do real forgiving without God.

When we live on the "outside of grace" there is blockage in our ability to both experience forgiveness and offer it. When we are living on the "outside of grace" God's presence and power within us does not "flow" because it is cut off from the source of forgiveness, that is God. When God's grace and forgiveness is not accepted or received by us, our own ability to forgive is impaired. Perhaps Matthew should be read more like God can not forgive us unless we forgive others rather than "Neither will your Father forgive your trespasses." Again, our ability to forgive is made available to us only by God. If we live on the "outside of God's grace," our own forgiveness and forgiveness of others just can't happen. Forgiveness is only possible in God and not simply done on our own. True forgiveness is a spiritual act and not just an emotional feeling. When we forgive, God is involved too.

Our own failure or inability to forgive in any situation probably indicates that in that moment we were living "outside of grace" and the forgiveness is not being accepted or experienced by us. If we are cut off from forgiveness then it can't be made available to others either. When that happens, we simply need to seek God's grace once more for ourselves, experience forgiveness and acceptance, and get back "inside of grace." God's "river of forgiveness" never runs dry. If we are thirsty for it, God is always ready to satisfy our "thirst." When that happens, we can offer it to others who are also "thirsty."

Our congregation has given generously for the Golden Basket projects and we sincerely appreciate the giving: To date the total for Golden Basket Giving for this year is \$4,087.43 What a great record for TUMC.

When you give to UMCOR projects, you know the full amount is used for that purpose.

It has been capably directed by Diane Martinez assisted by Joan Jessup and Ann Crutchley and volunteers. Please thank all of these people when you see them.








Raising Funds With Gift Cards

Gift cards make great holiday gifts for family members, friends and co-workers. Gift cards sold in California never expire so you do not have to worry about that possibility. If you have a merchant tell you that there is no balance on your card and you know that you have not used the card, please ask them to enter the number from the back of the card manually. This often works when the cards don't scan correctly. You can also call the 1-800 phone # on the back of the gift card and check the balance right on the spot.

- A tip to make using gift cards easier is to have a sharpie pen with you to write down any remaining balance left on the card. In all the many years I have used gift cards, I have never had a problem with losing a balance on a card. Many merchants have 1-800 phone numbers and web sites where you can check or track your card balance yourself.
- Pre-order your scrip so that you will have what you need for your holiday gifts. Don't wait until the last minute and hope that we have what you need. Occasionally, we do sell out of scrip especially near the holidays. It's impossible to estimate what will be popular this holiday season so pre-order when you can.
- A new law has gone into effect this year that helps you when your gift card has a partial remaining balance. If your remaining balance is less than \$10.00, then you can ask for the balance in cash. Most merchants know about this law, but you can pick up a copy of the law at the scrip table.

Enclosed in this newsletter is a copy of the gift cards (scrip) that we have on hand most of the time. On the other side of that list is an order form that you can use for pre-orders during the next couple months. If you pre-order your scrip we can have it ready for you to pick up in an envelope the next Sunday. If you don't already do so, please participate in this fundraiser so that TUMC can reach its goal of raising \$8,000 this year. Remember that this fundraiser *does not cost you anything and there is no work involved on your part.* There is no limit on the funds we can raise this way. Our only limitation is how well we support it.

HAVE YOU DONE YOUR PART TO SUPPORT THIS FUNDRAISER? It's very easy to participate. Just exchange your check for our scrip and go shopping instead of using your cash, check or charge at the store. Let's take advantage of this great opportunity we have been given. THANK YOU TO EVERYONE WHO HAS SUPPORTED THIS FUNDRAISER IN 2008!
