

Celebrating 25 Years!

TUMC continues to be one of the "bright stars" on the District and Annual Conference. Today, we are among the top 17% (by worship attendance) of all churches in our Annual Conference. Interestingly, TUMC and Moreno Valley UMC are the only two "successful" new church starts (with buildings) on the former Riverside District in the last 25 years.

One common experience of both churches is tremendous change. For example, church members on average, nationwide, only stay in one church for three years! To date, we have received over 1,100 members. Today, only 50 of our roughly 300 members remember building a church from the ground up. What a thrill it was, and what hard work. We owe a great debt to those "pioneer members" and Rev. David French, Founding Pastor. An additional 25 of our members remember the excitement of building our largest second Phase II construction that included Celebration Hall. All the rest of the members have joined since 2000. What a great journey it has been and we are not finished!

TUMC is blessed by an open and supportive spirit with many, many faithful lay persons giving excellent leadership. We can be proud of our outstanding community involvement and mission giving. TUMC is a special church and I am grateful to be in ministry with you all.

I personally invite you to our October 14th celebration that includes special worship with Dr. Bau Dang. Following our 10 a.m. worship, we will have children's activities, a BBQ and a Ministry Faire. Pick up our TUMC commemorative metal ornament to remember the day. We also have new TUMC shirts for sale. Join us!

Meet Our New Bishop

Bishop Minerva Garza Carcaño has been assigned by the 2012 Western Jurisdictional Conference to be the Resident Bishop in the Los Angeles Episcopal Area beginning September 1, 2012. The Resident Bishop provides leadership to the California-Pacific Annual Conference, which includes Southern California, Hawaii and other islands in the Pacific Ocean.

Bishop Minerva Garza Carcaño has always been a church person. Born in Edinburg, Texas, January 20, 1954, into a Methodist family, she is a third generation Methodist. Church has been her home throughout her life. As a child she knew she was attracted to the church, and later recognized the attraction for what it truly was—a call to the ordained ministry.

As a young person she was an active youth leader in her local church and in the Rio Grande Conference. Youth ministry introduced her to service in the connectional church. She served first on the Jurisdictional Youth Council of the South Central Jurisdiction. Her service to both her Annual Conference and the larger Methodist connection has continued. She believes service to and for others in the connection is a vital ministry.

Her ministry of service includes serving on Council of Ministry, Council of Finance, Board of Ordained Ministry, the General Boards of Global Ministry and Church and Society, the Board of the Publishing House, the General Commission on Christian Unity and Interreligious Concerns, and the General Commission on Religion and Race. She has also been on several general church special committees: Our Theological Task Committee, the Connectional Process Team, the Study Committee on the Relationship of the UMC and the Autonomous Affiliated Methodist Churches of Latin America and the Caribbean, and the Standing Committee on Central Conference Matters. She has served as a pastor in communities in Texas, California and New Mexico. She has served as a district superintendent in the West Texas and New Mexico area as well as in the greater Portland, Oregon area.

She was the founding pastor of the ecumenical ministry, the South Albuquerque Cooperative Ministry, in Albuquerque. Out of a continuing commitment to ecumenical and interfaith work, she has served as President of the New Mexico Conference of Churches and as the President of the Arizona Ecumenical Council. Churches in both areas honored her for outstanding ecumenical leadership.

In each area she has served she has worked with the Industrial Areas Foundation projects. She serves on the Southwest Industrial Education Fund Board. She was elected to the UMC Episcopacy in 2004. She has served as bishop of the Phoenix Area of the Desert Southwest Conference. She presently serves as President of the College of Bishops of the Western Jurisdiction.

Bishop Carcaño has had the opportunity to preach, teach, and speak at sessions of annual conferences, schools of Christian Mission, pastors' schools, youth and student events, at schools of theology, at a variety of United Methodist and ecumenical church events, and justice and human rights events all over the U.S. and in Brazil, Argentina, Cuba, Mexico, Zimbabwe, and Switzerland.

She continues to serve as the Chair of the Interagency Task Force on Immigration for the United Methodist Church, and is a lead spokesperson on matters of immigration reform for the Council of Bishops. She has been honored by the Sisters of Loretto for her work on immigration.

She is married to Thomas L. Spaniolo, a lawyer who specializes in immigration and criminal law. They have a daughter, Sofia T. Spaniolo-Carcaño, who is a student at Columbia College in Chicago, Illinois.

Introducing Rev. Myron Wingfield, Our New South District Superintendent

Rev. Myron Wingfield is completing his seventh year as Superintendent of the South District of the United Methodist Church. Myron was ordained in 1989 and has served churches in Virginia (Byrd Chapel – Zion UMC), Los Angeles (Westwood UMC), Atascadero (Atascadero UMC), and San Diego (St. Mark's UMC).

Beyond the local church, Myron has served as the Los Angeles District Youth Ministries Coordinator, as a member of the San Diego District Committee on Ordained Ministry, and as a member-at-large, Secretary, and Probationary Registrar of the Board of Ordained Ministry for the California-Pacific Annual Conference.

Myron has served as both a member and as President of the Board (1994-1996) for Sierra Service Project, Inc. Myron also holds a credential in mediation and conflict resolution from the National Conflict Resolution Center (NCRC).

Myron's wife, Rev. Martha Wingfield, is Associate Pastor of San Dieguito UMC in Encinitas. Martha has also served churches in San Diego, Atascadero and Santa Monica, and currently serves on the Board of Ordained Ministry for the California-Pacific Annual Conference. Myron & Martha have two sons, Jesse (20) and Luke (18). Jesse is a student at Mesa College and Luke attends University City High School in San Diego.

Born and reared in Virginia, Myron is the youngest of three children born to Rev. Arthur Wingfield and Willie Fariss Wingfield. He is a graduate of Emory and Henry College, a historic United Methodist School in Virginia, and he received his Master of Divinity degree from Candler School of Theology at Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia.

Myron says that, while his father led him to the vocation of ministry, it was his mother who led him to his avocation of cooking. He regularly prepares most dinnertime meals for his family and enjoys cooking with and for friends, as well. He collects cook books and scours rummage sales for cookware, cookbooks, and utensils. For recreation and fitness, Myron & Martha both enjoy long-distance bicycling.
