Stewardship & Finance Update

One of the goals of our Finance committee is to give the congregation timely and informative updates on how TUMC is funding our ministry together. Here is our latest summary.

Income (General Ministry Only):

Loan Balance: \$129,309

A quick review shows that our expenses have exceeded our income, through August, by \$11,000. The good news is that we are keeping up with our bills and still have cash in the bank because we had \$17,000 at the beginning of the year. Please note how much more we have paid in Apportionments over 2010. We also have had enough building fund donations to cover our mortgage payments each month. Just enough!

We thank all of you for your continued support of our ministry at TUMC.

Thanks to everyone who is buying scrip this year! Our YTD profit is just about \$2,500, so we need your help in order to reach our goal of \$5,000 this year. You can use scrip for your regular weekly purchases and our gift cards make great gifts for family, friends, and co-workers.

- 1. Exchange your check or cash for our scrip for your favorite stores and shop using scrip. Buying groceries with scrip is a great way to support our church. Some people even use scrip as a way to budget what they spend.
- 2. Give our special gift cards to family and friends to help them celebrate special birthdays, anniversaries, and other special occasions.
- 3. Use our gas cards, Arco or Shell, to fill up your gas tank. (You can special order other gas cards too).
- 4. Use our scrip to purchase your prescriptions; we have scrip for CVS, Target, Wal-Mart and all the major grocery stores.
- 5. Register your Ralphs, Food 4 Less, and Vons Cards linking them to our church for automatic rebates.
- 6. You can now reload select gift cards at ShopWithScrip.com, such as Starbucks, CVS Pharmacy, Barnes & Noble, Lowe's and more. (Get more information about this at the scrip table).
- 7. Purchase a Smart Card which earns TUMC \$15 for each card sold. This card gives you many ways to save at local merchants and restaurants.

E-musing from our missionary, Dr. Elma Jocson

Did I tell you I was born with a minor visual defect? It's astigmatism, a defect in the lens of the eye which results in distorted images. Mine is mild. An ophthalmologist said I have adjusted so I don't need to wear corrective lenses.

Ten months now since I started serving here in Ganta Hospital, Liberia, having served in Nepal for six years. I know about culture shock and a period of adjustment to a new work environment. It took me a year before I adjusted to Nepali culture. It was the loneliness, different food and a new language that were the major hurdles there. Here in Liberia I find a more difficult challenge. English is widely spoken but somehow miscommunication happens more than usual. There are only three MDs managing this 150-bed hospital. All three of us work as Generalist managing adults and children, pregnant and barren women, and medical and surgical patients. Thank God for the fourth MD, an eye doctor, who is gracious enough to take night calls and so gives us some relief.

What I find very trying though is the CONSTANT lack of basic needs—like gauze, alcohol, soap, disinfectant liquid, gloves and cotton. Of course there's no oxygen here. There is only one supplier for medical oxygen in Monrovia; somehow the hospital has functioned without it for a long time. It really irritates me when people call me 'Acting Chief Medical Officer' because I know it means they have a complaint or we need supplies that are not available. Once I was called to assess a patient in the Emergency Room. After examining the patient, I wanted to wash my hands. Thankfully, there was stored water. But there was no soap! I am whining, aren't I?

So aside from thinking about patients, I am burdened by ensuring that I have what I will need on hand. I am grateful that many of you have given, are sending or are devising plans to help. One thing is sure—your help is reaching the desired recipients. God bless you more!

Thank you all for your love and support. I am comforted and assured that God is near. Please keep praying for me.




