The expenses are coming in somewhat under budget, but we are running a negative balance in our general fund of approximately \$4,456. Now is a great time to catch up on your commitments if you found yourself taking the summer months off! We hope to be able to erase that negative balance by the end of the year.

Thanks to all of you who continue to support the church financially. Our mission continues to grow only through your generous support. An additional thank you to the members of the Finance Committee who contribute their time and talents to making sure the finances of the church are sound.

## *WHAT IS A PRAYER AND MEDITATION GARDEN?*

Eighty-five year old Todd Hailstone has dreamed for several years of putting in a prayer and meditation garden on the northeast corner of the church property. With encouragement from the Monks, Todd went before the Trustees with his idea and soon permission was granted. Mark McCullough acts as the Trustee liaison.

Just what is a prayer and meditation garden? What is its purpose? Have you ever felt the need to get away to a quiet and peaceful setting where your heart and mind can reflect on peace and tranquility? A prayer and meditation garden is the perfect setting for letting God speak to you. It is a peaceful sanctuary where one can feel spiritually uplifted. It is the ideal setting for prayer and meditation.

As you drive into the church property you will notice the first phase has begun. The land has been cleared, electricity has been brought to its borders, the old sprinkling system is already in place, and additional water systems will be added as needed. The garden will be designed to bring about tranquil reflections with walkways, trees and conveniently placed benches. For a biblical theme, three dozen olive trees are being planted, and shrubbery indigenous to this area will follow. As the garden evolves and a pattern emerges, we will feel God's hand in all of this.

How is this being financed? With contributions. Todd has been very busy soliciting contributions, both monetary and in time and talent from friends, acquaintances, church members, even his dentist! He has a persuasive way about him and those listening to his dream catch his spirit and want to be a part of this vision. We hope your heart, too, will be touched. With TUMC's tight budget, this garden can evolve only as contributions and labor are offered.

Soon a diagram of the garden will be made available. The Trustees along with Todd would like to have a Prayer and Meditation Garden Committee to help refine the plans. If you feel moved to participate, call Todd. Walk the walk with him. His enthusiasm is catching!
