

Stewardship Report for 2007

TEMECULA UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

A Fellowship of Amazing People and a Fantastic Place to Worship!

During the month of January 2007, TUMC held a wonderful, spiritually based experience culminating on Consecration Sunday held January 28th. The focus of our experience has been to use our financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in our relationship with God by supporting our church's mission and ministry with a percentage of our income. I am very happy to report the results of our campaign and the outstanding response of our Congregation members and friends. The following results are as of April 10, 2007.

A total of 101 families (husbands and wives, single parent families and singles) worshiping at TUMC completed *Estimate of Giving Cards* for the calendar year 2007. As of April 10, these 101 families have committed a total of **\$204,370.00**. This number is lower than 2006, but we had 16 more estimates in 2006 than this year.

Based on last year's (2006) giving records, TUMC can expect to receive an additional **\$54,600.00** during the coming year from 64 families who have consistent giving patterns during the past twelve months, but have not made estimates as of April 10, 2007.

Based on the average total of loose plate offering during the past three years, TUMC can expect to receive an additional **\$8,900.00** in 2007. TUMC also receives income from several other sources such as interest, facilities rentals, holiday offerings, and the sale of SCRIP for a total of approximately **\$59,600.00**. One last estimated source of funds are our fund raisers, the yard sale for approximately **\$5,000.00**. Adding all of these estimates together gives TUMC a grand total of **\$333,230.00** as anticipated income for the next twelve months (2007). The total amount (**\$333,230.00**) was used by the Finance Committee to pull together a 2007 budget for the Church.

The Consecration Sunday Committee knows of no other way to express our gratitude to all who support this Church except to say **Thank You and God Bless You** to all who worship and attend Temecula United Methodist Church and for your wonderful commitment to our future. You are the reason we were able to succeed in our campaign!
