Where Do We Go from Here?

As we approach Holy Week and Easter Sunday this year my mind drifts to the Thursday Jesus was arrested. That last week must have seemed like a strange week. It is for the disciples. They come into the city of Jerusalem the previous Sunday with shouts of Hosannas, "God saves." Then it goes downhill from there. They are thrown out of the Temple after Jesus overturns tables; there is a most unusual Passover meal and they go out to the garden. Judas sneaks off. When he returns, he is accompanied by a mob to haul Jesus away. The abuse, accusations and time of trial begins. The last verse (56) of Matthew 26 tells us "Then all the disciples deserted him and fled." They go to hide in an upper room, possibly the same room where they just had their Passover. They are afraid. Where do they go from here?

The next day after the rigged trial and stacked jury against Jesus is over, not even an appeal can save him. Pilate denies the plea. In reality Jesus wasn't much help for his own behalf. Jesus stumbles, struggles and is abused in his walk to the place where he will hang on a cross until he is dead. Where do the disciples go from here? At best the disciples just might be able to return to their lives prior to Jesus' calling them to follow. Peter, Andrew, James and John go fishing at Galilee, the others slipping back into obscurity. Where do they go from here?

It is a joy to share a little about Larry. You will find him busy in many areas of our church, and now you can get to know him better.

Larry was born in Detroit, Michigan and lived there until he was 7. Because of a divorce, his mom moved them to San Diego, there they lived with his grandparents. He went through school in San Diego through City College, where he studied electronics, but before finishing he went into the Air Force. They put him into

security as they had just become responsible for their own security and needed a lot of men, previously the Army and Marines took care of security for the Air Force. He was in the Air Force 4 years. After, he switched majors. and he completed his degree in Police Science. He applied to be a San Diego, State of California Marshal, was hired, and he liked his work.

In 2009, Larry and Sally moved to Temecula as their daughter, Carol, had moved here. They also wanted to be closer because they were very involved with Carol's son, Mason, who won many wrestling awards. Larry came to this church when Randy was Pastor. He has been active ever since. He is currently serving his second term on the Trustees. You may notice him taking photos at our various events as our sort of photo historian. He is always available to work on needed projects. For example, a number of years ago, the roof was partially off as the drains were being replaced, with no rain predicted, but rain it did. Of course then, there was a leak and ceilings and walls in room one, the utility closet and part of Pals had to be replaced. Larry is often seen in the kitchen as a regular in hospitality. He is active in the Monks and wherever he is needed.

His spiritual life is very important to him. He says that for him it is important to do what he thinks God wants him to do. At church he meets others who also strive to follow God.
