RICK'S RAMBLINGS

AND GOD SAID IT WAS GOOD!

Below you will read an article written by Sally Malec representing a new mission team formed under the auspices of the United Methodist Women and to be presented to the Church Council. I invite you to read this article and reflect on how you can take steps to help keep the environment healthy and be good stewards of God's creation given to us in trust.

*God created, saw, and said it was very good—
 capable of sustaining life (Genesis: 1-3)*

The United Methodist Women (UMW) have always been concerned about the human impact on the environment. This year one of the mission studies is on climate justice. Because of that our unit has decided to form a church-wide Green Team (Laura Robinson, Sally Malec, David French, Hazel Hailstone, Barbara Gaborko and Susan Garcia) to look at how we can lessen our impact on the environment.

Recently, I spent some time perusing the Internet for information about Environmental Christianity. There are thousands of web pages on Bible Scriptures dealing with the environment, quotes from famous people, ("God writes the Gospel, not in the Bible alone, but also on trees, and in the flowers and clouds and stars." - Martin Luther.) There are blogs written by scientists/environmentalists. I started feeling overwhelmed with too much information. How does a person assimilate all of the information out there so one can make the changes in one's life to live as God would like him/her to live with nature?

Rick's Ramblings continued

The Bible provides a witness to three kinds of relationships: our relationship with God, to one another, and to God's creation. These relationships are so interconnected that what happens to one affects the other two. In other words, when our relationship with God is abused, there are consequences for the land. Or when we treat each other with violence, the land suffers. It is the relationship of the relationships that is key here, both for understanding biblical wisdom and understanding what is happening today with regard to climate justice. (*Climate Justice – A Call to Hope and Action* a United Methodist Women study book).

The United Methodist Church's Social Principles give us guidance about God's creation. "All creation is the Lord's, and we are responsible for the ways in which we use and abuse it. Water, air, soil, minerals, energy resources, plants, animal life, and space are to be valued and conserved because they are God's creation and not solely because they are useful to human beings. God has granted us stewardship of creation. We should meet these stewardship duties through acts of loving care and respect."

The relationship with God and relationship with the Earth are very prevalent in the Bible, but we focus primarily on our relationship with God and not the earth. To honor nature is to honor God. Therefore, it is the Green Team's hope for TUMC to become a more environmentally friendly church while educating the members of the church to be planet conscious. In the coming months the team will be looking at how the church can better recycle waste (paper, plastic, aluminum, etc.) and how we can use environmentally friendly products. Please take time to prayerfully consider the church's and your impact on God's world. "Ask the animals, and they will teach you, or the birds of the air, and they will tell you; or speak to the earth, and it will teach you, or let the fish of the sea inform you. Which of these does not know that the hand of the Lord has done this? In his hand is the life of every creature and the breath of all mankind." (Job 12:7-10)
