Their year round self-sustaining transitional housing program does not receive any federal government funding, and serves over 200 individuals daily with an average of 40 - 55 children, single mothers, men & women, emancipated foster youth, domestic violence victims, seniors, mentally and physically disabled, veterans and entire families. Both programs provide comprehensive case management, employment assistance, transportation, food, clothing, medical assistance and more. They service the most vulnerable in our community...
