

MOVING FORWARD

There are four places people look for hope: the past, the present, the immediate future, and the distant future (the other side of the river).

The reason most people look to the past and dwell upon it is not because they want to live there. Rather, they see no hope in the present or the immediate future. So they look to past events, celebrations, and good times that brought them joy and a good life. The hope for the days gone by is that they will happen again. They only want to do things the way we used to do them. Or, perhaps, they are afraid they will not be a part of the people moving forward and want to hold onto their place in life by squelching new ideas and possibilities.

There are many who only see hope in the distant future. This is known as the other side of the river. They only see hope when they are at last with Jesus in eternity. They have experienced mostly discouragement and defeat, rejection and disappointment in the present. As they survey the immediate future of life they see no hope for realized joy for themselves or their community. There are a number of these folks who also look to the past, but they become so depressed about trying to live in the past that they believe anything new will help.

Because of one's accomplishments, or the celebrations and joys of today, or good times and good friends, there are people who see hope in the present. They act with a sense of joy and peace, they act with confidence and courage to do new projects and accomplish set goals.

Then there are those who know of hope in their present life, but that hope can be realized in the immediate future. There have been enough good times, celebrations and joy in the present to give those folks reason to continue to believe that hope will be realized. So they look ahead. There are enough objectives planned with reasonable goals to achieve those objectives to believe these will bring satisfaction to one's life. Even when it looks bleak in our world, there is enough hope welling up inside to have the confidence and faith that hope is not wishful thinking, but real.

FATHER'S DAY—JUNE 19th

The first celebration of Father's Day is thought to have been in July 1908, in Fairmont, West Virginia. Grace Golden Clayton suggested the special observance to her pastor after a deadly explosion in a nearby town killed 361 men.

Soon after, Sonora Smart Dodd of Spokane, Washington, wanted to show her gratitude to her father, who had cared for the family, six children including the baby after his wife died in childbirth. Dodd asked her pastor to choose a June Sunday to honor all fathers, and he selected June 19, 1910.

In 1924 President Coolidge suggested that Father's Day become a national holiday. In 1966, President Johnson designated the third Sunday of June to be Father's Day. Six years later, President Nixon instituted Father's Day as a national observance.

How about taking him out for breakfast before worship or for lunch after the service?

Consider starting a Memory Book for him. Collect papers such as his birth and baptism certificates, photos of him as a child, a student, a graduate, a groom, a father, at his job and so on. If your mother has any special letters from your father she would be willing to share with the family, put them in the scrapbook.

Some time during Father's Day ask him to tell stories about his most exciting adventures, meaningful religious experiences, his greatest joys, etc. Record these wonderful memories and then share them again on future occasions such as his birthday, anniversaries, family gathering, thanksgiving, etc.




