I want to thank those who donate food so that we could feed the hungry in our community. I want to thank those who make masks so others are protected in our community and in the Navajo Reservation. I want to thank those who have made the prayer quilts so those in need of comforting will know they are not alone. I want to thank those who help make the Sunday Morning Worship service possible so those able to connect with one another near and far and can celebrate God's presence in our midst. I thank each of you that continue to offer your gifts to keep our ministries, facilities and staff supported.

In following the news, you are aware that Churches are able to begin to open up for in-person worship services. I know some of you are anxious about coming back together. Others of you are hesitant about having any gathering and so to protect yourself and your family. Under the direction of the Church Council and Board of Trustees we have brought together a Reopening the Church Task Force. The objective of the Task Force is to develop protocols and guidelines that must be done and followed before we will be able to open as safely as possible for any on-site attendance. The Taskforce is following the guidelines set out by the State of California and the Center for Disease Control, as well as under the directive set forth by Bishop Grant Hagiya of the California Pacific Conference in which we are a member.

There will be a number of steps and actions that will need to take place to make this possible. The Task Force will develop a plan that must be approved by our Church Council and if approved then will be sent to our District Superintendent, Rev. John Farley, for his approval. Then and only then, will we be able to begin with the first phase of having limited in-person worship services. Once we get the approval, information and guidelines will be sent out in a mailing and posted on our website and on our social media. Other gatherings, such as Sunday Fellowship, dinner and other social gatherings, Bible Studies and other ministry groups, as well as outside groups will need to be phased in as we prepare.

WAYS YOU CAN GIVE

Dear Friends,

I hope you are well and coping in these times of change. I don't know about you but I often find it a struggle to just make it through the week. With the disruptions in our daily routine, it is sometimes difficult to do things in a new way. Like you, the Church is also finding its way in this new world, trying to cope with the needs of the congregation by providing new things like virtual church services and video logs. But just like everyone else, the Church still must take care of its facility and pay our utilities. So I thought maybe a list of the options available for members of our family to provide financial support to TUMC might be helpful. It is not an all-inclusive list but does note the primary ways you can continue to make donations to TUMC.

Personal Check or Cash

This is the way most of us have made donations in the past. Since we cannot currently pass the offering plate, you can send donations by mail or drop them off at the church. Pastor Rick is often available or you can deposit your envelope in the TUMC's mailbox near the main entrance. This method still works.

Online Checking

If you have signed up for online banking through your bank or credit union, most of you are aware you can make payments to just about anyone online via your financial institution's website. I like this method. It is fast and easy, I don't have to go anywhere and I don't even have to buy a stamp. You can even schedule your payments in advance.

TUMC Website (www.temeculaumc.com)

If you have not visited our website, give it a look-see. There is a lot of information about our church and a button to push to make a donation. Like online checking, this is also an easy way to make a donation. You can elect to have your donation charged to your credit card or make a direct transfer from your bank to TUMC (ACH Transfer). Remember if you use your credit card, TUMC will be charged a fee for this transaction. There is a box to select, if you want to add the service fee to your donation, so there is no charge to the church. Fortunately, there are no charges for an ACH Transfer.

Give Plus (Give+)

Give Plus is a free application you can download to your phone or tablet. It works very much like the TUMC website except you don't need to have a computer. After you set up an account, donations are snap and

only take a few seconds. Like the TUMC website, you can pay by credit card or ACH Transfer.

MISSIONARY UPDATE



I would like to introduce you to our new Missionary, Clara Mridula Biswas.

Clara is from Bangladesh and holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in social science and a diploma in rural leadership and development from the Asian Rural Institute in Tochigi-Ken, Japan. She serves at the Street Children Ministry in Cambodia, where she works with the 'poorest of the poor,' especially children, in slum areas and garbage dumps to facilitate their transfers to relocation and rehabilitation centers in Cambodia.

The program supports 620 students in public schools by providing classes in such areas as music, computer science, and art. It offers Sunday school and conducts Christmas and Easter programs each year. A health component refers patients to hospitals and non-governmental organization (NGO) health centers. Clara has worked for a long time with a church at one

of the dumpsites, and now also works with the Berung Kok Methodist Church in Phnom Penh's large slum area of Toul Kork, which is near the railway station and similar to the dumpsite areas. She also networks with other churches and NGOs, as well as visiting, monitoring, and caring for patients.

"To bring hope to the hopeless, bring light to those who are in the dark, bring Christ to the poor, and share the love of God," (Luke 4:18-19) summarizes Clara's understanding of her service. She sees the objectives as "sharing the love of God, helping children obtain an education by opportunities to study through scholarship, improving living conditions by providing vocational training, providing medical care and financial support to the ill, and with education creating awareness on human trafficking, human rights, and domestic violence."
