Rick's Ramblings**Big Idea**

GE premiered one about the birthing of an idea during the Super Bowl commercial. It opens with a not so good-looking (OK a downright ugly) "Muppet"-like creature beginning life in a hospital. It is ugly and scary and no one wanted to take it in or embrace it. The voice-over narrates as the "Idea" is searching for a place to belong until he is befriended by an employee from GE. He is taken in by this company and the idea becomes a swan-like beauty and a conduit to the growth and strength of the company. Here is the script of the voice-over:

*Ideas are scary.**They come into this world ugly and messy.**Ideas are frightening because they threaten what is known.**They are the natural born enemy of the way things are.**Yes, ideas are scary, and messy, and fragile, but under the proper care, they become something beautiful!**Great message. Will there be sacrifices by all? Yes! But making some changes and giving up some needed ownership will allow more to be a part of the church and allow more to participate in the growth, health and strength of the church. We will be able to do all the more for the Kingdom of God than we can individually.

Yes, ideas are scary, and messy, and fragile, but under the proper care, they become something beautiful! Let us nurture and grow the ideas God plants within the body of faith here at TUMC.

INTRODUCING TUMC'S NEWEST MISSIONARY

Rev. Meridith Whitaker is a missionary with the General Board of Global Ministries of the UMC serving as a Church and Community Worker. She is the director of Cookson Hills Center, UM Mission, a mission project to the Cherokee Indians in Cookson Hills, Oklahoma.

Rev. Whitaker works to develop programs that will help the people of this very poor area find ways to live within their means. Along with her staff, she administers a large Senior Citizens Nutrition Program, which includes lunches, craft programs, field trips, social events, health checks, and daycare for infants through age eight. She oversees cottage industries that include a recycling project making doormats out of vehicle tires, silk screening, an embroidery shop, ceramic, chalice making, and jewelry repair. Responsibilities also include the Health Resource Center, thrift shop, and craft shop that serve the low-income people of this tri-county region. She works with visiting Volunteer-In-Mission teams.

Meri is a graduate of Brockport State University in Rockport, New York, where she earned a B.S. in Physical Education. After teaching high school physical education for four years, she attended Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary in South Hamilton, Massachusetts, where she received a Master of Religion degree.



FOOD, FELLOWSHIP, FUNDS


