New Normal

Social distancing, wearing masks, theaters, and restaurants half full by design, and sports events without fans, these are just a few of the parameters that will be with us for the foreseeable future. These most likely will be the guidelines that will be put in place by local and state governments to help check the COVID-19 Virus until a vaccine or possible cure can be developed. This could take months at the least, or a year, or more.

If this is what the new normal will look like, it doesn't seem too appealing. But the alternative could be even more tragic: more illnesses, hospitalizations that stretch our resources, medical persons nearing collapse, more deaths and grieving for families and communities. This is suffering we do not want to have to live through. The alternative allows us to open up the economy in a safe and protective way that will bring revitalization back and restore jobs for those who found themselves unemployed.

As pastor and student of the Bible I have constantly encouraged and invited my congregants to turn to the Scriptures for guidance in times of struggle, grief, to find hope, faith, and how to love and live in the way of Christ. So, friends I ask that we turn to the Scriptures again as we learn how to live in the new normal in which we find ourselves.

I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us (Romans 8:18). During this time of isolation, we have been nudged or, more likely, shoved into making changes that we did not want to make. I have learned new things I wasn't necessarily looking to learn. But now I am living these new changes with hope and with possibilities to serve and reach out. I, with the help and skills of a few others, have learned how to stream our worship services live online over our Facebook page. I, with the help of Sally, learned how to produce and present a VLOG (video presentation) to continue to share a word of hope and comfort for not only our church family but for the whole community. I am relearning the gift of sharing the

This was passed on to me in a message from our bishop.
