A Message From Pastor Drew

Throughout 2025, we continue to attempt to throw our nets in new directions. There is a beautiful reality in these moments of service, watching our church community grow closer together through communication and sharing our journeys.

On Monday, February 17, our community came together to make lasagnas for Project Touch and for Jacob's House. On that day, we prepared 60 individual lasagnas and 4 larger "family-size" dishes to care for the physical hunger of our friends receiving care from these communities. We also took time to care for spiritual needs as well. We did not just send food for a time of nourishment; we also took time to create a care note to go with each individual serving of lasagna that was prepared.

When we serve others, we do not do it for acknowledgment; the goal is always to reach a need and empower our friends to have a moment of peace and care. Over her eighteen-year career as a Riverside County Deputy District Attorney, Kacey Sutton has specialized in community outreach and the prosecution of crimes involving financial abuse, predatory fraud, domestic violence, and child abuse. Outside of prosecuting cases in the courtroom, Kacey has presented to tens of thousands of students, educators, and adults on predator awareness, the impactful nature of words, and crime prevention. She co-founded the non-profit Women Wonder Writers, served on the boards of multiple nonprofits aimed at eradicating abuse, and actively mentors youth in the community. Kacey has authored unique curriculum dedicated to female and survivor empowerment, which has been taught in workshops, classrooms, and juvenile hall facilities across Riverside County. Kacey graduated from the University of Diego, summa cum laude, and received her law degree from Pepperdine University School of Law.

This now-classic novel was published in October 1920 and in 1921 won the Pulitzer Prize for Fiction, making Ms. Wharton the first female to be awarded the prize. The story is set in the 1870s, in upper-class, gilded-age New York City. Wharton



wrote the book in her 50s, after she was already established as a major author in high demand by publishers.

WHAT IS SCRIP?

Purchasing Scrip cards is a simple way of raising money for the church



budget. Simply purchase gitt cards at face value and the church receives a percentage of the sales. The Scrip box has a variety of cards including gas, stores and restaurants. You may also go to RaiseRight.com to see a full list of vendors. Cards may be preordered when orders are placed. Since the beginning of January, Scrip sales has raised \$520 for the church.

Cards can be purchased on Sunday mornings after service using cash, check or a credit card. Credit cards will have 4% service fee. Scrip cards are also available to purchase throughout the week during church office hours.

provides quality and affordable healthcare in the rural north As a not-for-profit organization, Ganta Hospital cannot afford to solely rely on the local intake that are not regular. Further, the hospital's "affordable" fee-for-service falls far below the costs of services provided. Even with the minimum charges, some of the struggling rural subsistence farming families cannot afford to pay the full amount. Therefore, the management is mostly left with no alternative but to waive those fees. This situation requires the hospital to seek external supports to mitigate this gap in revenue generation. While also realizing management must be creative in identifying self-sustaining services in the hospital to minimize reliance on outside supports. We are therefore pleased to report that contributions (of funds, supplies, equipment, etc.) from our partners helped keep the hospital stable and fully operational.



El Porvenir believes all people deserve clean water, safe sanitation, and the knowledge to sustain it for the generations to follow. We partner with the people of Nicaragua so that they can build a better future for themselves through the sustainable development of Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WaSH) education projects.
