

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR DREW

I would like to begin by reflecting on our March 1, 2025, mission project that focused on moments of advocacy and support for our siblings in the LGBTQIA+ community. There was an unexpected byproduct of this gathering. Siblings within our church who were excited about this opportunity began to share information about the events with other community groups they participate in throughout the Temecula Valley. The result of this word-of-mouth outreach was staggering. Art Salyer and I had the wonderful opportunity to meet with the leadership of The Temecula Valley Pride Center, and this became a collaborative effort between our care groups.

I am frequently asked about specific outreach adventures the church can participate in. My common response is, "Is there a community group already doing that we can team up with?" This collaborative work was a shining example of that concept. Through the guidance and leadership of The Temecula Valley Pride Center, doors were opened, connections were made, and a beautiful display of support was provided to the community of Temecula Valley.

On April 5, we will have our next ministry outreach focus. We will be meeting in the TUMC community garden to celebrate our place as caregivers through Environmental Theology. Beginning at 3 PM, we will spend some time in the garden tidying things up, and at the end of our work time, we will transition into our First of the Month worship time, having a time of prayers and hymns in the garden. Please make plans to be a part of this event. It will be a wonderful time of community building, creation care, and worship.

We have also begun our preparation for Easter. It was a blessing to celebrate the acknowledgment of the ashes together in worship. In my preparation for the Ash Wednesday service, I felt it was important to attempt having both a morning (for our friends who do not drive at night) and an evening (for our working friends) gathering for this time of worship. These were so well attended that I will be doing the same for our Maundy Thursday and Good Friday gatherings as well.

As we move into Holy Week this month, we will have an 11 AM and 7 PM Maundy Thursday service, which will include Communion at each service. We will also host an 11 AM and 7 PM Good Friday service. The Good Friday service will be a more reflective time on the crucifixion of Christ and on who assists us in carrying our pains. I look forward to this opportunity, as this will be my first Holy Season with TUMC.

Easter morning will also fall into place in April. Please mark your calendars; we will have a 7 AM sunrise service that will process the emotions of those present at the tomb on that special day. We will also have our traditional service at our regular worship time of 10 AM. As we celebrate the resurrection in our lives, I pray everyone will be blessed and stirred by these offerings.

Please continue to pray, be present together, and worship with us during this time of celebration. May the light of Jesus Christ shine in this time of restorative resurrection.



What is Script? Purchasing Scrip cards is a simple way of raising money for the church budget. Simply purchase gift cards at face value and the church receives a percentage of the sales. The Scrip box has a variety



of cards including gas, stores and restaurants. You may also go to <u>RaiseRight.com</u> to see a full list of vendors. Cards may be preordered when orders are placed. Since the beginning of January, Scrip sales has raised \$520 for the church.

Cards can be purchased on Sunday mornings after service using cash, check or a credit card. Credit cards will have 4% service fee. Scrip cards are also available to purchase throughout the week during church office hours.

Housing - A rent-reduced, shared-living stay on our campus for up to 14 moms and their children at a time. Families live three to a house with a combination of private and shared space.

Education - During their two-year stay, women are equipped with resources, mentoring, accountability, education, and community connections designed to empower them and their children to sustainably thrive.

Accountability - Village residents commit and are held accountable to living agreements that ensure safety and enable the thriving growth of all, including moms, kids, staff, and volunteers. These include responsible and supportive co-living, active participation in weekly classes, progress and follow-through toward set goals, clear and honest communication with the advocacy team, and a commitment to physical and emotional safety.



On January 7, strong Santa Ana winds in Los Angeles caused wildfires to spread rapidly in multiple communities. Thousands of homes and businesses have been destroyed, as well as multiple local United Methodist Churches. Preliminary

assessments of the damage is underway. UMCOR has awarded two solidarity grants to the California-Pacific Annual Conference to undergird their immediate relief efforts. This includes evacuee support like food and essential supplies as well as support for volunteer efforts and other relief activities. Join us in this response.
