

I get asked from time to time why I attend as many PRIDE offense as possible. Here are a few of my reasons:

- 1. Support: it is important for "straight" folks to participate in these events in order to show support of the LGBTQIA+ community. It shows that you are willing to be part of that community and support them in a very personal and direct way.
- 2. Love: our faith tells us to love everyone, even though we don't completely understand them at times.

Pride Events give us that opportunity to love that community.

- 3. Know someone: many folks have never met, talked to, gotten to know, or made friends with somebody in the LGBTQIA+ community. Many of us grew up not understanding or even being frightened of folks from this community. These events are a great way to get to know people that perhaps you don't know.
- 4. Fun: Pride Events are, as a rule, celebrations. They are fun, energetic, full of love, and pride. You will for sure have a good time at these events.

You will see postings of Pride Events in the Messenger. Feel free to reach out to me or pastor Drew for more information. You are always welcome at these events. As a reminder, we have the Amplify Group that meets at our church every Thursday at 6:30 PM. This is an LGBTQIA+ community group, including supporters. East Congo has been called the "rape capital of the world" — a place where rape is used as a weapon of war. To support women who are victims of sexual violence and those abandoned by their husbands and families, the United Methodist Church in eastern Congo established the center in 2018.

The Tennessee, Memphis and California-Pacific conferences joined with the East Congo Episcopal Area, raising funds to build the self-care center. Every year for more than three years, the center has mentored United Methodist pastors' wives, women who have been sexually abused and those who have been abandoned by their husbands.

What is Script? Purchasing Scrip cards is a simple

way of raising money for the church budget. Simply purchase gift cards at face value and the church receives a percentage of the sales. The Scrip box has a variety of cards including gas, stores and restaurants.

You may also go to RaiseRight.com to see a full list of vendors. Cards may be preordered when orders are placed. Since the



beginning of January, Scrip sales has raised \$520 for the church.

Cards can be purchased on Sunday mornings after service using cash, check or a credit card. Credit cards will have 4% service fee. Scrip cards are also available to purchase throughout the week during church office hours.
