

I have been fortunate to meet with the Social Work Action Group, the Interfaith Council of Temecula, Jacob's House, and numerous other care facilities that cater to the diverse needs within the Temecula Valley.

As I began my time here with two significant projects, we are currently working on a major initiative for 2025. We are not only striving to complete 12 different mission projects that address 12 distinct areas of need within our community but also collaborating with Temecula Valley Pride and Emily Space to provide an affirming celebration and gathering for our LGBTQIA+ siblings. I am excited to share that on October 18, 2025, Temecula United Methodist Church will have the honor of being the site for Temecula Valley's first Pride celebration.

This bold step not only affirms our LGBTQIA+ siblings' journeys but also demonstrates that Temecula Valley is a community willing to support, celebrate, and care for all its members. I ask that you remain in prayer, as this opportunity will open doors for everyone to see that Temecula United Methodist Church is a place that genuinely cares.

I am eager for the many opportunities that lie ahead. In 2026, I look forward to watching our outreach projects grow after spending 2025 focusing on one mission project each month. My hope is that individuals will discover passion projects through these initiatives. As each person identifies their passion, we can begin to build small groups that intentionally care for these areas year-round. Through this approach, we could expand from having 12 mission projects a month to possibly 36, depending on how many small groups develop as individuals find their places for service.

It is my prayer that in year two, we work together, serve together, and uncover our passions. By opening the doors for others to find their passions as well, we can witness not only the growth of our church community but also the imagery of hope flourishing throughout the Temecula Valley.

Please join me in prayer and explore ways we can volunteer together. The more we discover our passions, the more our hearts will grow, and the greater our capacity for love will become in our community. Thank you for a wonderful first year of service, and I look forward to seeing what year two will bring.

Sherman Indian School

Sherman Indian High School is one of four Boarding Schools still

under the Bureau of Indian Affairs, the Office of Indian Education. Started as Perris Indian School, 1892, Perris, Ca., and later moved to Riverside in 1903, and renamed Sherman Institute. Sherman Indian High School has undergone many changes, and unlike former Boarding Schools whose focus was assimilation by eliminating "The Indian," the school now offers a balanced program that seeks to assure a quality education to students from many tribes, along with cultural awareness and inclusion. Temecula Community Food Pantry

The Temecula/Murrieta Food Pantry is a local place where low income and homeless people can sign up to receive food. They offer NPR services as well.
