



Supporting Families Amid SNAP Disruptions This November



As we move into

November, current governmental limitations are creating significant challenges for families with lower incomes, many of whom must now seek new sources of nourishment and care. Recent reports indicate that the federal shutdown has canceled emergency funds for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), threatening nearly 42 million Americans.

In California alone, about 4 million residents rely on CalFresh (California's SNAP program), and many are facing delays in their November benefits, which average \$200 per household. This underscores the urgent need for additional support for those facing food insecurity.

Through the Pastoral Missions Outreach Fund, we are working diligently to provide groceries for many of these families. However, we anticipate growing needs in the weeks ahead.

Please continue to pray for and support the Pastoral Ministerial Outreach Fund. While some have asked about storing food on campus, this presents challenges. We lack dedicated space, and we cannot store perishable items — which are often the most needed.

By funding grocery cards, families can purchase milk, eggs, and other essentials for a balanced diet. Studies show that access to grocery assistance significantly improves food security and health outcomes, making this support especially critical now.

As November begins, please keep these families in your thoughts and prayers as many face new and pressing needs.
