


BOOK BUDDIES

Joel works closely with the conference executive director of connectional ministries in coordination of Hispanic/Latino ministries, including border ministries in the San Diego and Imperial County areas.

Justice & Compassion Committee

The Justice and Compassion Committee provides aid for individuals in times of conflict and displacement.







Transitional Housing with 260 beds to assist single mothers, families, Veterans, seniors, and the disabled – averaging 40 - 55 children daily throughout Riverside County including an emergency housing program.

Local Winter Emergency Shelter provides overnight shelter for approximately four months per year December to April – to meet the needs of hundreds of homeless each winter. Serving dinner and breakfast 7 days per week while shelter is open.

Police Response Program responds 24/7 to calls from local police departments to assist in homeless and abuse situations.

Direct Emergency Assistance for food, clothing, transportation assistance, hygiene items, and various emergency needs.

Community Food Program utilizes our long standing business relationships and new partnerships to provide a stream of food donations that not only feeds our clients in transitional housing, but also supports other local non-profit partners and churches that assist the community.

Resource Referral Center responds to hundreds of calls monthly to provide appropriate resources for any given situation. Project T.O.U.C.H. partners with Social Services, Drug and Alcohol Rehab programs, Mental Health Service, Homeless Prevention Programs, and other community outreach programs.


