

## Welcome, Bienvenidos, Maligayang Pagdating, Shalom

"Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God." (Romans 15:7)

This passage from Romans doesn't seem like a warm Christmas Scripture when we first read it, but I chose it because of the key word "welcome." As you may have guessed, the words in the title of my Rambling are welcome in different languages: English, Spanish, Tagalog (Filipino), and Hebrew. Biblical Scholar Jennifer Vija Pietz, New Testament Professor, Lutheran Seminary Saint Paul, MN shares "The word "welcome" can have various connotations. It serves as the standard polite response to being thanked and as an indicator of hospitality on doormats, but when used in this way, does it truly imply Jesus' teaching to welcome the stranger? Pietz goes on to point out that "the welcome" Paul describes in Romans 15:7 connotes something deeper than exchanging pleasantries or a general appearance of hospitality. The Greek verb behind it, proslambano, can also be translated as "accept" or "receive."

When I read this understanding of "welcome" as "receive," I thought of the blankets that wrap the newborn child and are presented to the parents by the staff in the maternity units at the hospitals. We call these blankets receiving blankets. The child is wrapped and welcomed by the parents without judgement, full of love and acceptance.

As we move through the season of Advent, the four weeks prior

to Christmas, we are anticipating the arrival and the coming of God in the birth of God's son, Jesus. We will once again prepare to "receive" the Christ Child in the manner that Christ receives us, wrapped in the unconditional love of forgiveness and acceptance. Paul writes that the Christian community is to receive and accept without judgment so that the community can be reconciled and made whole, as the greeting of Shalom is translated.

As I reflect on the past year, it appears that too much emphasis has been placed on what causes division: the violence and hatred that shatters the community and the world, the acts that judge and exclude to push others into the minority of our society. I come back to this passage from Romans as this year's Christmas Message to receive one another, to receive the "others," the minorities of our society, as God in Christ receives each of us.

This Christmas, let us Welcome strangers, especially first-time visitors to our church. Let us invite our friends and neighbors to one of our special worship services or programs this year.

Sally and I want to share a special Merry Christmas and Happy New Year with all our Family in Christ.

951-676-1800 ext. 2. These various teams enable and empower our Church Family to live out our worship, ministries, and missions.

#### **CHURCH COUNCIL**

In addition to those who serve on the Church Council by UM Book of Discipline policy, there are others who are invited to serve as persons from the congregation in general to help shape the vision, programs, and ministry of the Church. This group meets once a month, usually taking two months off throughout the year. Persons who wish to serve will do so on a year-to-year basis.

#### **WELCOMING AND OUTREACH**

This team works together to develop welcome material that can be distributed to newcomers and possible New Members. They help the Pastor host a New Member's Class as well as reaching out and contacting current members as a nurturing and "how are you doing?" connection. Prior to the worship service, the team also assists with the Welcome Table. People who serve on this team will meet every other month.

#### **MISSIONS**

This team makes recommendations and chooses the Golden Basket and other Special Mission offerings. They have chosen to support Global United Methodist Missionaries. They educate the congregation on local and global mission needs and support local Church Mission Teams.

#### **WORSHIP TEAM**

Persons from the congregation help with input on worship services and support those who volunteer in some of the worship tasks: liturgist, ushers, sound technicians, greeters, Altar set-up, Communion set-up, and take down. The Team meets quarterly.

#### FINANCE COMMITTEE (AT LARGE MEMBERS)

The Finance Committee oversees the income and expenditures of the Church which includes creating and recommending a yearly budget that is approved by the Church Council. The committee gives input and makes recommendations for expenditures. They also oversee the yearly Stewardship Campaign. The Committee meets once a month. Persons who wish to serve will do so on a year-to-year basis.

#### **SCRIP PROGRAM**

Janet Galbraith heads up a team of persons who are willing to help sell scrip after the worship service.

#### FAMILY MINISTRIES TEAM

Persons serving will help in developing Christian Education, Fellowship and Nurturing Ministries. Supporting Tiffanie Roman Family Ministry Director and Gian Adesso Youth Director. Persons serving on a year-to-year basis.

#### **BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

People who serve on this committee oversee the physical care of Church Property. This also includes making sure the Church is properly insured. The Trustees review and oversee the groups that rent the facility. This group is the legal entity of the Church. People who serve are on a three-year cycle, from 2023 to 2025.

#### **STAFF PARISH RELATIONS COMMITTEE**

This committee is the group that acts as a liaison between the staff and the congregation. They make sure that the staff is supported by developing job descriptions and pay as well as supporting staff as they carry out their ministry jobs. The committee also makes sure all labor laws are followed and sets up policies that are in accordance with Federal, State, Local, and Church laws. This group meets every other month. Persons serving do so for a three-year term, 2023–2025.

#### Nominating Committee

People serving work with the Pastor to connect with the congregation and seek people for various committees, teams, task forces, and leadership positions to nominate and recommend for service to be approved by the Church Conference. They serve for one to three years. Meet in the fall prior to the Year End Church Conference. Meet three to four times, plus online connections.

#### TIME WITH FRIENDS TASK FORCE

This task force is reformulating a former rendition of a previous Task Force, as a part of nurturing the church family in fellowship. If you volunteer to be a part of this task force, you will be a part of developing and coordinating opportunities for church family and friends to come together to fellowship in various ways, i.e., dinner groups, card players, movie nights, etc.



# Servant Volunteer of the Month for December, 2022 Penny Wagner

It is a joy and a pleasure to share the wonderful Penny with you. She is a native Californian, born in Los Angeles and grew up in Van Nuys. Penny was adopted at birth by loving, hard working parents who also adopted her brother. At first, her parents did finishing work on tract homes, getting them ready for their new owners. Later, they purchased a pillow and hassock factory. They had well known clients such as J.C. Penny, May

Co, Bullocks, Robinsons, and others.



This is where Penny first learned her sewing skills at the age of 9. At 12 years old, Penny's parents took in a baby girl from friends who could not care for her. A bit later they adopted the baby. Penny took care of her and frequently babysat.

Penny went to Van Nuys High School. She took many science classes as well as a nursing assistant course because she always wanted to be a nurse. She received an A.A. degree from L.A. Valley College. At San Diego State University, she received her B.S.N and worked for 2 years at the Los Angeles Children's Hospital.

In 1976, she married and moved to San Diego, where she worked at Children's Hospital San Diego. Her husband was a teacher of science and math and later an Apple Computer distributor who wrote computer programs. In 1978, they adopted Marta from the hospital. Penny took care of Marta for the first 22 months of her life there. Marta had special needs, including deafness, and required specific medications and long-term care. In 1982, they divorced but continued to work together to raise Marta.

In 1986, Penny adopted Vanessa. Vanessa spent 17 months in the hospital. Penny's big heart just had to add her to her family. She came home on oxygen and lots of meds. Both Marta and Vanessa were preemies, which contributed to their special needs. At the time Penny brought Vanessa home, she was raising Marta, teaching at Pt. Loma College, working at the hospital, and completing her MSN. Her mom came to help, and sometimes Penny would hire a babysitter. Marta went to the California School for the Deaf when she was 12 to complete her education in an environment that would meet the educational needs of a deaf student.

In 1991, Penny bought her current home in Temecula, and her parents moved in with her to help with the children. Her dad passed in 1994 and her mom in 2018 at the age of 100! In 1992, Penny received her Pediatric Nurse Practitioner degree at USD. She worked at Children's Hospital until 1994, then in a pediatrician's office in Riverside as a Nurse Practitioner for 5 years. Then she became a school nurse for 15 years in Lake Elsinore and retired in 2012. She still works and continues to perform vision and hearing tests for school districts.

Penny got into theater here at our church when we used to put on plays. She became part of the Temecula Valley Players and had several roles. She also makes props, costumes, and does alterations. She is in the Temecula Valley Master Chorale and in our choir. Here she has served on many committees, including: Trustees, Trustee Secretary, SPRC, Worship Committee, Prayers and Squares, Scrip and wherever she can help out.

In 2007, her grandson, John, was born. She describes him as "the light of my life." Two years ago, she found her biological sister and has a wonderful relationship with her and her husband. Penny says she has been very blessed—God has always been there, showing me the way.

Penny describes her spiritual philosophy thusly: "I do the best I can to do what I think Jesus would do." "I try to be kind and helpful and make life better." "God is part of our lives, and even if things don't go our way, it all makes us stronger." What a blessing Penny is to us all here and, over the course of her life, to countless others.
