Changes

There is an old adage: "Change is the only constant in life." This is not only an adage (an old saying) but is a truth, a truth that was expressed by the Greek Philosopher, Heraclitus around 500 BCE. Now there might be debate by some on this. But if someone were to say I'm in as good of health and shape as when I was young, this is a constant. That wouldn't be completely true; yes, we may do all that we can by eating right, exercising, and living as stress-free a life as possible, but our bodies would still be changing and adapting, as would our eating and exercise regimen to remain in good shape.

As I observe, there are at least two types of change. One that occurs naturally, such as our bodies changing or the weather and seasons changing, and changes caused by the actions of individuals, groups of people, or

humanity. When I was growing up and driving up the Old 395 from San Diego, eventually in the mid to late 1970s giving way to the 15 freeway, there was hardly any development between North County San Diego and Corona/Riverside. I went away to seminary in the Chicago area and returned, and Rancho California had been incorporated into the cities of Temecula and Murrieta where development exploded.

Change that is brought about by people can be for the good or for the bad, depending on the motivation of those attempting to bring about the change. What we find many times in the midst of changes are struggles and resistance to change. This is what occurred as Jesus lived his ministry and called everyone to live as if the Kingdom of God were present, which it was in the person and spirit of Jesus the Christ. Jesus was ushering in changes. One that the Priest, Pharisees, Scribes, religious leaders, and Roman authorities didn't want. The change Jesus was calling people to make was a restoration of God's way of reconciliation, love, and forgiveness. To care for those on the margins of society, those that were different and seen as weak.

As we walk this Lenten journey with the Spirit of Christ, we are to focus on the change that is still occurring in our midst. Lent is a time to use the Spiritual disciplines: fasting, prayer, scripture reading, worship, repentance, and giving to others. In growing our ability to use these disciplines we can be a part of the body of Christ to help realize the presence and bring to completion of God's reality of a wholeness and reconciliation of all God's creation. Will this happen in our lifetime? We don't know, but probably not. What we do know is that if we don't walk in the way of God's love as expressed by Jesus, it will not happen in our lifetime.

This Lenten season, take the time to stop and observe. I believe you will see the change even in the midst of a war in Ukraine and other conflicts around the world. You will see the change occurring even as we continue to struggle with the results of the Pandemic. You will see the change occurring even in the midst of your own life's struggles.

Our Vision is "Striving to End Spiritual and Physical Hunger." When we develop and support the ministries that are inclusive, affirming, forgiving, hopeful, helpful and loving our neighbor we are living the change to live out our vision.

I invite you to take the time to read through the offerings that are about this Change for Christ that are included in this Messenger newsletter. I encourage you to participate where you can as a part of your Lenten Journey.

There is a sign-up sheet on the table outside by Pastor Rick's office. Please give us the gift of your stories.


If you are too shy, write up a paragraph and send it to the office to be in the newsletter.
