

From the Social Principles contained in the United Methodist Book of Discipline come these words in the part on the Natural World: "All creation is the Lord's, and we are responsible for the ways in which we use and abuse it. Water, air, soil, minerals, energy resources, plants, animal life, and space are to be valued and conserved because they are God's creation and not solely because they are useful to human beings." God's creation provides for us life, joy, and peace. I think of the expanse of the Grand Canyon on my visits and the wonder of God's creation, like the Colorado River that runs through it, and God's power and strength. When I see the California poppies, I am amazed at how precious and delicate God's creation and life are.

Think of those places near and far where you find life, joy, and peace in God's creation. For me, one of those places is the beach. For some, it may be hiking in the mountains or desert. For others, it may be in your backyard, surrounded by the annuals and perennials that you have planted and tended to in your garden. Just imagine that we at Temecula United Methodist Church can provide such a space for our church family and our community.

Under the vision of Todd Hailstone and the partnership of Joe Benvenuto, they created such a space. It is our Meditation Garden. Over the years, benches have been added, along with various flowers and plants, and a beautiful cross that greets you when you enter the space, which was made by Larry Murphy. This small oasis has offered a place for individuals and

Just recently, a member of the church contacted me to ask if her family and friends could gather to celebrate the life of a dear friend of the family. Two members of our Church Family see the vision, have the passion, and are willing to take the lead to help our Church Family to revitalize this jewel first begun by Todd and Joe and overseen by God. Anne DiPardo and Pat Stone have already begun this work of love and are inviting others to join them. You will see in this Messenger your opportunity to come out and help in pulling weeds, cleaning statues, and other tasks in preparation to make this space fully accessible for all people. If you aren't physically able to help but would like to support the revitalization and care of the Meditation Garden, you can make a gift out to TUMC and mark it "Meditation Garden". A small group, under the guidance of the Trustees, will choose the types of plants that will best grow in the garden and live out the continued vision for the garden. 



Amplify is a growing community of Jesus followers and seekers who desire to gather together to draw closer to Jesus through worship, through the reading and study of Scripture, through conversation and connection, and by engaging in meaningful discussions around the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, his all-inclusive, saving message of grace and love, and what it means for us to follow him today.

We seek to amplify our faith and hope in

Jesus. We believe that Jesus was God incarnate that he was God with us, the Word made flesh—and because we believe that the entire biblical story ultimately points to him, we want Jesus to be the lens through which we read and interpret all of Scripture; we want to deepen our knowledge and experience of him as Father, Son, and Spirit; we want to strengthen our faith in the truth he reveals about who our God is, and about our value and worth in his eyes; we want to fortify our hope in his grace for us and the freedom, forgiveness, redemption, and restoration he offers; and we want to learn how to participate with him in his kingdom and how to follow him in his way of light and love.

Community food drives and donor funds feed an amazing, giant-scale collection and distribution warehouse, where their quality control staff inspects and processes truckloads of donated food every day before it is used at the food pantry.
