We Are Family

Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. Deut. 6:4-7

It is our calling and responsibility as members of the Church Family to support and encourage families in the congregation to help their children to learn about God, Jesus, the Holy Spirit, the Church, the teachings of the Bible, and their faith. One way we do this is by offering Sunday School for our children. A time for them to come to church, spend some time worshiping with the church family, then go to their Sunday School class. They will be led by caring volunteers who are willing to share and pass on their faith as they teach the curriculum that offers lessons and activities that help the children learn about God, Jesus, the church, and how to serve.

There is a statistic that has stuck with me for quite some time: "85% of the people who come to Jesus do so before the age of 18. Let us remember that the Bible doesn't tell children to become like adults to be saved. Rather, it tells adults to become like children to be saved. The call is not to care for the children and youth, so the church will grow and have younger people do the work around the Church. Churches can grow with people of any age. The call is to grow the faith that leads to sharing and living the Love, Agape, of

God through Jesus the Christ. We don't have Sunday School to grow our church; instead, we have Sunday School to bring people into a relationship with Christ. This happens when we offer this ministry and programs for children and their families in our community as well as in our Church.


grow stronger with joy and love. If you have questions, you can contact Pastor Rick.




We enjoy reading, discussing, and socializing with others who share our interest in and love of books.

WHAT IS SCRIP?

Purchasing Scrip cards is a simple way of raising money for the church budget. Simply



purchase gift cards at face value, and the church receives a percentage of the sales. The Scrip Box has a variety of cards, including gas, stores and restaurants. You may also go to RaiseRight.com to see a full list of vendors. Cards may be preordered when orders are placed. Since the beginning of January, Scrip sales have raised \$520 for the church.

Cards can be purchased on Sunday mornings after service using cash, a check, or a credit card. Credit cards will have a 4% service fee. Scrip cards are also available for purchase throughout the week during church office hours (check or cash only).

This fund helps members of the church and the community with emergency needs, such as rent, gas, and food.




Housing - A rent-reduced, shared-living stay on our campus for up to 14 moms and their children at a time. Families live three to a house with a combination of private and shared space.

Education - During their two-year stay, women are equipped with resources, mentoring, accountability, education, and community connections designed to empower them and their children to sustainably thrive.

Accountability - Village residents commit and are held accountable to living agreements that ensure safety and enable the thriving growth of all, including moms, kids, staff, and volunteers. These include responsible and supportive co-living, active participation in weekly classes, progress and follow-through toward set goals, clear and honest communication with the advocacy team, and a commitment to physical and emotional safety.
